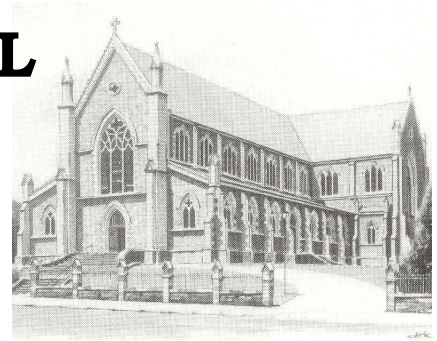

We are judged by our treatment of refugees - Bishop

Refugees are among the most vulnerable people on the globe, and Australia will be judged as a world citizen by the way it treats them, said Australian Catholic Social Justice Council Chairman, Bishop Christopher Saunders.

Bishop Saunders called for a more compassionate response to asylum seekers. 'There is a desperate need for leadership from both sides of politics on this issue. If our attitude to refugees in recent months is any measure of our humanity, we will be found badly wanting', Bishop Saunders said.

'Australia sees only a tiny proportion of the world's asylum seekers. The US, Canada, France and the UK see many times more than we do. Measured against 42 million forcibly displaced people worldwide, including 16 million refugees and asylum seekers, Australia's annual allocation of fewer than 14,000 places under the humanitarian program is small. The vast majority of displaced people are seeking shelter in developing countries, Bishop Saunders said.

'Australia's recent suspension of processing for Sri Lankan and Afghan asylum seekers is regrettable', Bishop Saunders said. 'Applications for asylum should be assessed on individual circumstances, not simply on nationality. When it abandoned the 'Pacific solution', the Rudd Government promised that asylum seekers would be detained for the shortest time possible. Australia must keep that promise.

'The facilities at Curtin, such as they are, are extremely unwelcoming - nothing more than a primitive detention centre devoid of resources and set in the midst of an inhospitable environment. They are indicative of a national attitude lacking in compassion and care for those who have suffered so much already.

'We can afford to be far more compassionate and humane in our response to people fleeing desperate situations and in dire need,' Bishop Saunders said.



Hard times demand justice for the most vulnerable workers

Australia's lowest-paid workers should not have to carry the costs of job protection, the Chairman of the Australian Catholic Social Justice Council (ACSJC), Bishop Christopher Saunders, says in his annual Pastoral Letter for the Feast of St Joseph the Worker on May 1.

The Pastoral Letter refers to the Australian Fair Pay Commission's current review of the federal minimum wage.

'This wage should provide for a decent standard of living not only for workers but for their families', said Bishop Saunders. 'Currently it is not keeping pace with rising costs of living – particularly the skyrocketing costs of rent.

'The Federal Government and the Fair Pay Commission must bear in mind those who have struggled to survive on low wages and income support when most benefited during the years of prosperity. This financial crisis was not of their making. They should not be deprived of the wage increases they need to meet their basic costs of living.

'Those seeking work, too, need to be assured that they will be protected from poverty when they are in work.

'Ensuring a decent minimum wage safety net will be a most important factor in providing security for working families who rely on the minimum wage and income support.

'The fundamental rights of families to establish a home, to welcome the sacred gift of life and raise a family require the guarantee of a decent family wage', Bishop Saunders said.

Australia Fair? A nation at the crossroads

Australia is at the crossroads according to the Chairman of the Australian Catholic Social Justice Council, Bishop Christopher Saunders, who has issued a Pastoral Letter for the Feast of St Joseph the Worker (1 May).

Comparing the circumstances of the richest and poorest Australians following the global financial crisis, he says, 'How we respond to the needs of the poorest individuals and families will characterise the spirit of this nation.

'Over the past decade, minimum wages have fallen further behind average weekly earnings. Safety net wages, even when supplemented by family benefits, have not prevented families falling into poverty or coming close to it.

'In 2009, the Australian Fair Pay Commission imposed a wage freeze on 1.6 million safety net workers with the aim of preventing job loss and promoting economic recovery. This burden has not been carried proportionally by the average income earner, and still less by those at the highest levels of the wealth spectrum.

'While the lowest paid workers endure a pay freeze for the sake of Australia's economic interests, the Productivity Commission recently dismissed suggestions of pay caps or reduced tax concessions on executive remuneration on the grounds that this "could damage our national economic interests", Bishop Saunders said.

Drawing on Pope Benedict XVI's Encyclical, 'Charity in Truth', the Bishop highlights the need for long-term development with adequate protections for low paid and unemployed workers.

'Equity and justice must be built into the operation of the market and not remain just an afterthought. The market must not be a place where the strong subdue the weak. The minimum wage decision that Fair Work Australia makes in June will be a critical test of this nation's fairness,' Bishop Saunders concluded.
