Second Sunday of Advent

10 December 2023

First reading: Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11 Prepare the way for the Lord. **Responsorial Psalm:** Lord, let us see your kindness, and grant us your salvation.

Second Reading: 2 Peter 3:8-14 We wait for new heavens and a new earth.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia alleluia! Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight paths:

all the people shall see the salvation of God. Alleluia!

Gospel: Mark 1:1-8 Make straight the paths of the Lord.

Every once and a while you come across a book that has a profound impact. This book came from a reference in the new book by Julia Baird as she quoted a particular poem. Fascinated by that poem I managed to source the poetry book to read more. The book is called "The Weight of a Soul" by Laura Gilpin. Like much of poetry it is based upon her own experience and reflections of life. Laura Gilpin was born in 1950 in Winconsin, USA and completed an Arts degree followed by a Nursing degree which became her career. During her time as mainly a palliative nurse she created this beautiful book of poetry plumbing the mysterious depths of illness, family and dying. Laura herself sadly experienced much of this first hand as she succumbed to a brain turmour dying at the age of 56. Her poetry lives on as a wonderful memory of her connection to the gift of life itself. One of the poems I read yesterday was titled, "Father". It begins, "Once I tried to measure your shadow. We were standing in a field in early evening and our shadows lay quietly at our feet: mine, the small shapeless shadow of a child and yours, tall and definitive, stretching out into the field ahead."

When I read this I wondered is that how John the Baptist felt as he stood with Jesus as the sun faded behind them. That great sense of inequality between them. Did John the Baptist wonder, "What could I possibly do that would come close to measuring up to your shadow? That shadow you cast upon the world bringing hope and new life to so many?"

The poem continues, "Don't move, I called to you, I'm measuring your shadow and one foot in front of the other I began to count step by step but my feet were so small"

Advent is an opportunity for us to welcome the presence of Christ in a deeper way. It is a time to find the "new born" child that lives within us – urging us on to be kind, thoughtful, not self centred, but spirited and spontaneous, prayerful and reflective, gracious and thoughtful.....

Maybe its time to step out of the shadow of Christ and experience him face to face. No longer living in the shadow but allowing Christ to draw us forth into a world filled with life. A time to embrace the real presence of Jesus who is born in us again at this time, so we walk in the light with him. Don't live in the shadow of Christ, but let Christ live in you! John the Baptist did. As we light each candle on our Advent wreath we illuminate a little more, we remove a little more of the shadows – we bring the light into the world once again.

We are that light!

The ending to this beautiful poem, I first read as a negative. But if we consider it an invitation to walk in the light, it is seen differently....

"Finally I stopped and turned around to look at you far across the wide field: a small smudge on the other horizon. Walking back now across the field I begin to count again one foot in front of the other, but all I can measure now is the distance between us."
