23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

10 September 2023

First reading: Ezekiel 33:7-9 If you have not warned the wicked man, then I will hold you responsible.
Responsorial Psalm: O that today you would listen to my voice! Harden not your hearts.
Second Reading: Romans 13:8-10 Love is the fulfilment of the law.
Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia alleluia! God was in Christ, to reconcile the world; and the Good News of reconciliation he has entrusted to us. Alleluia!
Gospel: Matthew 18:15-20 If your brother or sister listens to you, you will have won them back.

MERCY – Receiving and Giving

The scripture Readings offered to those who gather for prayer and worship in the Christian Tradition these next weekends in September, include three passages from Matthew's Gospel.

They carry a special edge for us because Matthew's own story is very much included and reflected in the receiving and giving, the binding and loosening of the shackles of guilt and fear and shame that are running through the experiences and teaching described. Matthew was a public servant – a Jew who chose to work for the Roman occupying forces; that's his first 'sin'. Matthew holds a license to collect taxes for the enemy from his own people. Probably he has some freedom to add a comission on top of the basic tax and makes use of the 'privelege'. All in all Matthew is not the most popular man in Galilee! He's a traitor and quite probably feathering his own nest!

Let's have a look at what Jesus brings to the conversations and experiences referred to by Matthew.

A The early Christian communities attached much importance to the <u>community</u> of believers. Every individual had their own life to live surely, but it was their <u>shared</u> experiences of listening and diserning, the readiness to forgive one another and to seek that forgiveness from one another, their honesty and admission of guilt, their offering of mercy, encouragment and sustained membership in the community that sustained them. We have individualised the important processes of reconciliation with God and with our sisters and brothers to our great loss I think.

B To survive, probably, the Church as a society of people has to exist alongside 'other societies' – but we must always endeavour to live and act in Jesus' way – which will often be regarded as foolish. But I think it is TRUE that the number of people who have turned away from God because they found the Church too forgiving is not large. But many have abandoned God and Church because they found Christian people, as individuals and as a community, <u>unforgiving!</u>

C Is there a limit to forgiving?

Jesus clearly rejects Simon-Peter's attempt to draw the line maybe SEVEN times??? Jesus responds – 'Peter, there is no end to the willingness of God to forgive... the LOVE God offers and calls us to offer is without limit. There is no keeping of scores and records. Love and mercy have no bounds! WE ARE CALLED TO LOVE and FORGIVE AS GENEROUSLY AS GOD LOVES and FORGIVES.
