First reading: Exodus 17:3-7 Give us water to drink.

Responsorial Psalm: If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts.

Second Reading: Romans 5:1-8 The love of God has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit which has been given to us. Gospel Acclamation: Glory to you, Word of God, Lord Jesus Christ! Lord, you are truly the Saviour of the world; give me living water, that I may never thirst again. Glory to you, Word of God, Lord Jesus Christ!

Gospel: John 4:5-42 The water that I shall give will turn into a spring of eternal life.

"Before the Coffee Gets Cold" by Toshikazu Kawaguchi

"These are the rules for time travel," Kazu said, "You can only encounter people who have been in this café, you must not leave your chair, and you must finish before the coffee gets cold, and one more important thing, there is nothing you can say or do in the past, that will change the present". It was a strange café, called, "Funiculi Funicula". It was famous once for it's special gift of time travel, but that was a long time ago and people didn't like the rules. Once a lady visited who would sit with her husband and talk. Slowly her husband developed dementia and would not have a memory of Kohtake, his wife. For a long time, Fusagi would come holding onto a envelope with his wife's name on it, but would not hand it over to her, as he did not remember who she was. Kohtake decided to go back in time to the moment Fusagi first held the envelope. A time before he began to forget. Knowing the rules, and accepting that whatever was in that envelope it would not change the present situation she found herself in, she sat in the required seat and received her coffee and found herself in the past.

When Fusagi finally handed her the envelope, she opened it and read the contents. Fusagi said he knew that he was developing dementia, and he knows how much Kohtake loves him and how much he loves her. "You are a nurse, and I know you are aware of what will happen to me. When I no longer know who you are, I want you to leave me. Do not care for me out of pity, but live your own life and just remember our love." Her time came to an end as the tears flowed and she drank the coffee before it got cold and returned to the present.

The next day, Fusagi comes to the café as usual, sits in his usual spot and begins to flip through the travel magazines that he always brings. Kohtake approaches the table and her husband claims not to know her and tells her to find another table. She answers by saying, "Oh, I thought I might make a new friend, as I'm new around here. Would you mind if I sat with you and had a chat for awhile, maybe we have some things in common?" So she sits and shares the common life that they previously shared, but now as strangers making links of, surprisingly similar life stories.

Later in the book we discover the moral of the four stories that are experienced. "The present doesn't change – nothing about Fusagi changed, but Kohtake came to enjoy her new conversations with him. Kohtake returned to the present that was still the same, but she discovered that it was her heart that had changed."

The Samaritan woman lived with the shame of her past. We find her at the well in the hottest time of the day – not with the other women at a cooler time – either by choice or by design. She was living a past she can not change and a present that causes her pain and isolation.

Yet Jesus opens her heart to see things differently – that the living water is for all, wherever they find themselves in their journey of life. It brings new hope for a new life.

For the Samaritan woman the present has not changed, people will still treat her the same, but her heart has changed. She sees life differently and believes more deeply in a loving and forgiving God that will never abandon her.

Can we dare to hope God may change our hearts this Lent, even though our present stays the same?
