THIRTY THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

13 November 2022

First Reading: Malachi 3:19-20 The sun of righteousness will shine on you **Responsorial Psalm:** The Lord comes to rule the earth with justice.

Second Reading: 2 Thessalonians 3: 7-12 Do not give anyone food who refuses to work.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! Lift up your heads and see; your redemption is near at hand. Alleluia!

Gospel: Luke 21: 5-19 Your endurance will win you your life.

On 6th July this year, our Congregation celebrated the centenary of the death of our Foundress, Blessed Mary Theresa Ledochowska. At first glance, it may seem strange to 'celebrate' the anniversary of her death because joy is not an emotion usually associated with death. Birthdays and weddings are joyous occasions - but death?

However, when we examine it a little more closely we realise that we are, in fact, celebrating both a birthday and wedding! The Church celebrates the feast days of its saints on the day they died, calling it their "birthday in heaven". Christ is the bridegroom of every soul, so the moment of death is the moment we meet our Bridegroom face to face for the first time. How could this not be a moment of joy?

Mary Theresa died in 1922, surrounded by her Sisters. One of the Sisters described the moment: "I was kneeling at the foot of her bed and could see her face clearly. Suddenly it lit up and our mother began to laugh. I could not help crying out: She's laughing! This drew the attention of the others, who at first had not noticed it. Our mother was laughing with unspeakable joy, with an outpouring of unspeakable gratitude."

We are beginning at the end, though. Perhaps we should take a step back and look at life, the joys of life, for the joy at death is only the pinnacle of the joy of living.

Most photos and paintings of Blessed Mary Theresa show her in a serious mood, but as Roland Quesnel C.S.Sp writes in his biography of her "the joy with which Mother Ledochowska went to meet God was typical of her life. Those who knew her said that she was always brimming over with interior joy, even in the midst of the worst tribulations. She lived in a permanent state of thanksgiving... Everything in her came from love of God and union with God" ('Go Out to the Whole World', p. 186).

For us Missionary Sisters of St Peter Claver, the celebration of the 100th anniversary of the death of our Foundress, has been an opportunity to remind ourselves of the joy of her death and the joy of her life; and to dive once again into her charism, into the "flood of joy" that is evangelization (Pope Francis, Message for World Mission Day 2014): a flood that we wish could inundate the whole world. Indeed, we must not only *wish* this, we must *help* it to do so! Our Constitutions state: "Our priority is to transmit to others the fire of Christ that burns in our hearts, to spread ever further the love for the Mission so it may take root in all hearts." (Art 4, par 2). It is therefore, our obligation to share this "fire of Christ", this "flood of joy" which is evangelization. "Joy cannot be held at heel: it must be let go. Joy is a pilgrim virtue. It is a gift that walks, walks on the path of life, that walks with Jesus: preaching, proclaiming Jesus, proclaiming joy, lengthens and widens that path...The Christian sings with joy, and walks, and carries this joy." (Pope Francis, May 10, 2013).

St Paul wrote: "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice" (Phil. 4: 4-5). To this we add "Amen" and ask our Foundress to intercede for us, for you and your loved ones. May each and every one of us experience the "Joy [that] cannot be held at heel".
