

First reading: Acts 3:13-15 You have killed the prince of life; God, however, raised him from the dead. **Responsorial Psalm:** Lord, let you face shine on us.

Second Reading: 1 John 2:1-5 Jesus Christ is the sacrifice that takes away our sins and those of the whole world.

Alleluia, alleluia! Lord Jesus, make your word plain to us: make our hearts burn with love when you speak. Alleluia!

Gospel: Luke 24:35-48 It is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead.

After Easter I had the opportunity to travel to Melbourne to see the Titanic Exhibition. The Titanic has been something I have been fascinated with from a little child. I'm not sure whether it was the loss of life – the arrogance of humanity – the importance of the people aboard at the time – the courageous crew – the resulting change to shipping procedure or perhaps it was just the grandeur of such an endeavor. It was something I kept scrapbooks about and read many articles and watched the movies etc. It was well worth going to see this worldwide tour with some 200 artifacts from the ocean floor on display, and to read the stories of those who were aboard – those who survived and those who died. (112 Yrs ago this Monday!)

During my three days in Melbourne I had the opportunity to experience the city and it's people and it's food! A trait that my parents shared with all of us was the ability to engage in conversation with just about anyone and just about anywhere. Dad was always on for a chat. I channeled Dad in a couple of places in Melbourne. The man who was on his way home from his biannual visit to see his brother in Melbourne. He worked on the bridges etc on the railway and so was returning by train as he loves to travel that way. Or when I got chatting to Winnie who was returning to Hong Kong after visiting her son who was studying at the University. He seemed to be settled and achieving in his field of study, if not a bit lazy! Winnie is a professional pianist herself and is employed by a number of expensive Motels in Hong Kong to provide high quality musical entertainment, with other musicians in their restaurants and other areas depending on what atmosphere is needed.

By far the conversation that I remember well is the waitress at a Chinese restaurant – Rachel. Her actual name, I discovered later is Kung Chang. Her English teacher whom she admired suggested Rachel for her "casual" name as it picks up the "ch" in her real name. We got chatting and decided to have coffee the next day, which we did. Rachel has a one year visa for study that began in July last year. During that time she has traveled a lot around Australia, which I suspect is a big part of why she is here. As we conversed I learnt a lot about China. At the age of 38, Rachel is the product of the "one child" policy of China. Ironically now they are trying to problem solve an ageing population. Interestingly she spoke of her loneliness here in Australia and difficulty in making friends. A big part of this she puts down to the fact that growing up her relationship with her father was distant as his work regime meant he had little time to spend with family. She is very proud of an app she developed that assists fathers and their son/daughter to access opportunities at different times of the day to connect effectively. The activities would be organised through the app as group experiences, such as bike riding, fun ball games inside, all designed to give a sense of bonding through action. It has been difficult in many ways for Rachel to adjust because of her low self-esteem and lack of confidence. If I helped her in any way to feel ok about herself just by listening then I thank God for being in the right spot at the right time.

When I reflected on this Sunday's gospel I was struck by the desire the disciples had to share what they had heard and seen.
All the disciples asked of people is *TO LISTEN!*

How are we going with our listening skills? Are we engaging on a deeper level? Do we "bother" to read between the lines?
