# 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### HOW COMFORTABLE ARE YOU FEELING UNCOMFORTABLE?

The Panthers rose victorious for the NRL 2023 season. This left many sad, some devastated, and yet others simply uncomfortable. Not the biggest Broncos fan myself, I had to be very careful about how I passed comment regarding the game. Feelings were high, and many supporters of the losing team seemed to need time for lick their wounds.

The referendum this weekend has many (arguably all) enrolled voters uncomfortable in one way or another. Whatever the outcome, the tensions and public controversies have not resulted in the most comfortable of feelings.

Just over a month ago, most of the priests of Queensland ordained 10 years and less gathered at Jamberoo Abbey near (Sydney) for a few days of ongoing formation. Two of the priests who were already in charge of their respective parishes had very different experiences to share: The first had been involved in a major parish restructuring and overall – strategic planning, leadership training, community assemblies, ministry team management, etc; the second had hit major backlash when he simply went to update the computer (used only for the overhead slides) from an operating system nearly twenty years out-of-date.

Change is uncomfortable. We all respond to or resist change in different ways; different places and peoples vary in their culture of change.

What kind of parish – how uncomfortable of a parish – are we prepared to be? From where will this discomfort come? ... novelty, creativity, innovation ... inertia, stagnation, repetition...

As a parish, we have recently launched a renewed vision and new strategic plan. Parish council is also recruiting new members. That sounds to me like quite some potentially exciting change. I wonder how uncomfortable these changes will make each of us. I wonder how we will respond or react to the changes.

Where might be a space you are prepared to feel uncomfortable? How uncomfortable are you ready to be for the sake of the Mission? Would you rather be uncomfortable from sitting too long or dreaming too big?
