17 September 2023

First reading: Sirach 27:30-28:7 Forgive your neighbour's faults and when you pray, your sins will be forgiven. **Responsorial Psalm:** The Lord is kind and merciful; slow to anger, and rich in compassion.

The vibrant Carnival of Flowers in Toowoomba is in full bloom & and we are thrilled to introduce something new to happen at St. Patrick Cathedral. On October 1, 2023, Sunday at noon, we invite you to join us for the first-ever Filipino Mass at St. Patrick Cathedral, Thanks to the Dean of the Cathedral, Fr Michael O'Brien for his full support of this gathering. This multicultural gathering will celebrate the remarkable story of St. Lorenzo Ruiz, the first Filipino saint.

St. Lorenzo Ruiz was born to a Chinese father and a Filipina mother, he lived a devout life in Manila, until false accusations in 1636 forced him to seek refuge with Dominican friars. This decision led him to Japan, where Christians faced severe persecution. Despite enduring unimaginable suffering, Lorenzo refused to renounce his faith. On September 29, 1637, he met his martyrdom in Nagasaki.

Lorenzo Ruiz's martyrdom is about his love for Jesus Christ. Despite torture, he refused to renounce Christianity and declared, "I am a Catholic and wholeheartedly do accept death for God; Had I a thousand lives, all these to Him shall I offer." This commitment to his faith ultimately led to his beatification and canonization by Pope John Paul II. His beatification in 1981, during Pope John Paul II's visit to the Philippines, marked the first such ceremony held outside the Vatican. Six years later, he was officially declared the first Filipino saint. The same Pope, John Paul II beatified Mary of the Cross Mackillop on 19 January 1995 at Randwick Racecourse, Sydney.

Lorenzo Ruiz's faith serves as an inspiration not only to Filipinos but to Catholics worldwide, including Australians. Just as Saint Mary of the Cross Mackillop is revered in Australia Lorenzo Ruiz holds a special place in the hearts of Filos, **showing that faith transcends borders.**

The story of St. Lorenzo Ruiz bridges Australia and the Philippines through faith. The Toowoomba Diocese started to welcome Filipino missionary priests, creating a connection that enriches our parish and Diocese. It was, Fr. James Byrne who first went to the Philippines to recruit Filipino missionaries and continued by Bishop Emeritus Robert McGuckin.

The Filipinos worldwide celebrate the Feast of St. Lorenzo Ruiz, honouring him as the patron saint of overseas Filipino workers and migrants. May his example inspire us to live our Catholic faith and embrace the diversity of cultures that enrich our parish.

We extend a warm invitation to you all to join us on October 1, Sunday, 2023, at noon for the first-ever Filipino Mass at St. Patrick Cathedral Toowoomba. **Don't Worry the mass will be in English (with a Filipino Accent)**. After the mass prepare yourselves to enjoy Filipino Tucker while listening to the Song and Dances for a short program at the parish centre and of course you can bring your own plate. Ta!
