Being loved and being "in love"

What is the worst kind of poverty any person can experience? What indeed is the deepest and most destructive experience of poverty in Toowoomba, in Australia, in the world?

Well - my life experiences and many other life experiences shared with me by others lead me to one mysterious, heart-breaking answer:

The worst experience is to have <u>NEVER been LOVED</u> and often of course the real truth, which is every bit as devastating, is to have NEVER KNOWN OR FELT LOVE.

Friday just passed was observed throughout the Catholic world as the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. It's a feast celebrated in the western world since the Middle Ages and particularly promoted in France by a religious Sister Margaret Mary Alacoque in the 17th Century. Artists since then have had a "field day" in representing Jesus with his heart exposed to get us all thinking about the love, intimacy forgiveness and willingness to empty Himself for others (including each of us) that He is all about. There will be many memories of paintings highlighting His Heart that had pride of place in our

houses, schools, hospitals and churches.

The Second Vatican Council embraced and spelled out for us the key elements behind this devotion to Jesus' Heart _ the celebration of His humanity, his suffering dying forgiving and leading us to a NEW way of living, and the Eucharist as an intimate experience of communion in, and with Him. The Council calls all into centering our lives in that relationship.

We are loved without having to earn the gift. Love pours out of the Heart of God unconditionally, endlessly, affirming each and every one of us as beloved daughters and sons of the Father, sisters and brothers embraced and empowered to forgive and love.... especially the woman and man who have never known LOVE.

With the gift of God's Spirit may we all be drawn into that Divine Circle of Loving that is God. Falling in love is at the very heart of God, and that's a reason to "fall in love with each other".
