**First Reading:** Isaiah 22:19-23 – I place the key of the House of David upon his shoulder. **Responsorial Psalm:** Lord, your love is eternal; do not forsake the work of your hands. [Psalm 137]

**Second Reading:** Romans 11:33-36 – From him, through him, and in him are all things.

Gospel Acclamation: ALLELUIA! ALLELUIA! You are Peter, the rock on which I will build my Church; the gates of hell will not hold out against it. ALLELUIA!

Gospel: Matthew 16:13-20 - You are Peter; to you I will give the keys of the kingdom of heaven.

### Names That Matter

You would no doubt agree that at present the most used word in mass media and our conversations is Covid-19! What does covid-19 stand for? As you would be aware it is an acronym for **CO**rona **VI**rus **D**isease of 20**19**. Then what is coronavirus? It is a type of virus that has crown-like spikes around it. That's why it has the word in it. The word "Corona" is a Latin word for crown. With this in mind let us consider todays gospel passage.

#### Herod and Philip: Caesura Philippi

This Sunday's gospel passage is from Matthew. He wrote it to Jewish Christians, setting the scenario in the background of the region on Caesarea Philippi. There had been a sanctuary dedicated to the Greek God, Pan. Herod had built a temple there, in honour of Augustus Caesar, in 19 BCE (before the common era). Later Philip the son of Herod rebuilt this city and named it Caesarea Philippi to honour the Emperor Tiberius and added his own name. He ruled until 33 CE (common era). Thus, Caesarea Philippi resounds with symbols of power and authority of the Roman Empire. By the time the Matthean gospel was written people who have been living in this region were aware of the destruction of Jerusalem in 70 CE, mainly due to the Roman troops celebrating their victory over Jewish territory here in Caesarea Philippa.

#### **Commitment to a Cause**

The above setting for the great confession of Peter has brought about a powerful message. Primarily the Jewish Christians had been persecuted by the Emperor Nero subsequently nine Emporers did the same until 313 CE. The main reason for the persecution was that Christians did not worship Caesar and refused to give him the titles such as Son of God, Lord, Saviour of the world.

These titles were inscribed on the coins of that time in the Roman Empire. Yet contrary to this factor all the Christians who willed to be baptized profess their faith in that

Jesus is the Son of God - not Caesar;

Jesus is the Christ (Kristos in Greek), the Messiah, the anointed one - *not Caesar*; Jesus is the Lord - *not Caesar*.

Certainly it has been the main reason that Peter and his companions were marked to be crucified. Peter, the rock and the others were never weakened by the threats of Caesar. They believed firmly in Jesus Christ who gave new life to them, not death. Therefore Jesus' question "Who do you say that I am?" is not simply about Jesus' identity but rather witnessing – being with him. Witnessing the power and authority to serve people, not to abuse the power given to him. Therefore as followers of Jesus we've got the authority by baptism to love and serve. The authority is the key of spiritual power to open up a new realm of relationship in order to empower others.
