First reading: Isaiah 45:1-6 I have taken the hand of Cyrus to subdue nations before his countenance. **Responsorial Psalm:** Give the Lord glory and honour.

Gospel: Give to Caesar the things that belong to Caesar and to God the things that are God's.

Dual Citizenship

G'day to all in Christ,

The Gospel, according to Matthew 22:15-21 speaks of the wisdom of Jesus when he said, "Render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's and to God the things that are God's." This straightforward but profound teaching resonates in the life of Chiara Lubich, the founder of the Focolare Movement.

Chiara Lubich, an exceptional Italian woman of faith, goes through the road map of the two worlds of "Caesar" and God and emphasizes the importance of dual citizenship.

In the Gospel, Jesus encourages us to give Caesar the things that are Caesar's. This means that we must fulfill our earthly duties, just as Chiara Lubich and the members of the Focolare did. They were professionals, experts, and lay people trying to make the world a better place. Their mission is to be good citizens, obey the law and contribute to society, just like you and me in Australia.

Yet the gospel also calls us to give to God what is God's. This is where Chiara Lubich's wisdom shines. Her "Fourth Way" teaches us that we, too, belong to God's divine plan. Our primary allegiance should be to God. This spiritual dimension of our life is equally important.

Chiara Lubich's book "The Art of Loving" shows us the way. It reminds us that we can't just go through the motions in life. We must permeate our daily lives with God's love to face the challenges of living our faith in a secular world.

As a priest born overseas, I face the unique experience of being part of two cultures and often two worlds. I can relate to the idea of dual citizenship. Chiara Lubich's message encourages us to integrate our faith into all our lives. It is about bringing our personal values and our beliefs to our roles as responsible residents or citizens here in Australia. As we consider this dual citizenship, let us ask ourselves how we can be better citizens of both realms. How can we engage with the world fulfill our responsibilities to society while deepening our relationship with God and promoting love and unity in our daily lives?

Chiara Lubich's legacy and her book "The Art of Loving" provide practical ways to guide us. With her life, she showed us that it is possible to give God and Caesar what is due. By accepting these dual citizenships, we become witnesses of God's love in a world that sometimes forgets it. Let us embrace our dual citizenship with the devotion, love and wisdom of Christ's teachings. In this way, we can be a living proof of a harmonious life in two worlds, honouring God and Caesar, in our beautiful country of Australia. Amen.
