**First reading:** Genesis 22:1-2 The sacrifice of Abraham, our father in faith. **Responsorial Psalm:** I will walk in the presence of the Lord, in the land of the living. **Second Reading:** Romans 8:31-34 God did not spare his own Son.

Gospel Acclamation: Glory and praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ! From the shining cloud the Father's voice is heard: this is my beloved Son, hear him. Glory and praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ!

Gospel: Mark 9:2-10 This is my Son, the beloved; listen to him.

## A PREFACE TO LENT

Before entering the Eucharistic Prayer proper, we hear the priest praying the *Preface*. This prayer is meant to set the tone and invite all those gathered into the great hymn of thanksgiving. Throughout the year, there are eight options from which a priest might choose. Each Sunday of Lent, however, has its own custom text; this is based on the gospel account read at the same Mass. On weekdays, there are a selection of Lenten options. I would like to present the first (default) options with some brief commentary.

The text begins "It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks – This is roughly how every Preface text starts. 'Eucharist' is often translated as 'thanksgiving', and thanksgiving is a constant of Christian life. Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God, through Christ our Lord – Such describes Mass as a whole, but especially the anaphora (Eucharistic Prayer): We pray to the Father, through the Son, and with the Holy Spirit.

For by your gracious gift each year your faithful await the sacred paschal feasts – Time is a gift from God. Every day is not our own. with the joy of minds made pure – Fasting and almsgiving are not without reason. They help us let go of the noise which clutters our lives and the baggage we carry. so that, more eagerly intent on prayer – this could also be worded 'more eagerly intent on our relationship with you [God]. and on the works of charity – Lenten disciplines are meant to facilitate Christian love for neighbour; so, this could as easily be re-worded 'on the work of caring for others'. Paired with the previous line, we see the great(est) commandment of Christ to love God and love neighbour (Matt 22:35-40; Mk 12:28-34; Lk 10:27).

Then it turns toward Easter, continuing: *and participating in the mysteries by which they have been reborn* – Lent is not a time to forget the redemption that Christ has won for us; in fact, if we lose sight of Easter at any point during this forty days, there is a chance we might need to adjust our approach. *they may be led to the fullness of grace that you bestow on your sons and daughters* – 'they'; not 'I' or even 'we'. This prayer and all the prayers and practices of Lent are meant to make us better... but this is not about us being better for ourselves only; this is about being better <u>with God</u> and <u>for each</u> other.

The prayer concludes with Angels and Archangels ... with all the hosts and Powers of heaven ... Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of hosts."
