CHRIST THE KING: A NOT-SO-HUMBLE END TO THE LITURGICAL YEAR


Clocks and stopwatches typically start and/or end at the top of their rotation. Just like the annual calendar, reaching the end or beginning of a lap is the most momentous of occasions. Jan.

Talking about the liturgical year with the RCIA group earlier in the year, something dawned on me: our sense of the liturgical year is very different to the (Gregorian or luna) calendar year or even the financial year. These secular measures of time revolve around and culminate in the celebration of the new year.

Sep. The Liturgical year revolves around Easter. So, the end of the year is not the pinnacle but the furthest point on the wind-down or living-out of Easter; and the beginning is the very start of preparations.

// ing :ung If we were to flip back to the clock analogy, Easter is a bit like midday. The first Sunday of Advent is less like the great ball drop of Times Square; it is a lot more like the quiet early hours of the morning before dawn. And - though this last Sunday in the liturgical year commemorates Christ the King - this is really the trailing off of the year; kind of like the moments before dropping off to sleep or the silent seconds before midnight.

When the liturgical year was first being formed, it was always counted as time before Easter and time after Easter. These counted weeks became known as ordinary time (from the ordinal numbers used to count them). Then, a dedicated time of penance and preparation (Lent) was set aside for the whole Church to journey with catechumens and those preparing for baptism at Easter.



Even Advent is a funny time of year. As the celebration of Christmas grew in significance, a kind of false or imitation Lent was placed in the four weeks preparing for Christmas. All the rest of our seasons and feasts are subject, nevertheless, to this great arc or cycle leading up to and flowing from Easter.

So, how is your Easter life going? Are you still celebrating the resurrection, or are you feeling more ready to celebrate the coming of Christ? As we journey through Christmas keep in mind the liturgical year and the preparations we undertake to celebrate our year with Christ.
