Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

28 January, 2024

First reading: Deuteronomy 18: 15-20 I will put my words into the prophet's mouth, and he will tell them all I command. **Responsorial Psalm:** If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 7:32-35 The unmarried woman dedicates herself to the things of the Lord, that she might be holy. **Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia alleluia! The people in darkness have seen a great light;** a radiant dawn shines on those lost in death. Alleluia!

Gospel: Mark 1:21-28 This is a new kind of teaching that speaks with authority.

ORDINARY-TIME PROPHETS

Where in your life might you be called to be prophetic?

I'm not talking about telling the future, having wild dreams, or anything like that. I'm talking about Spirit-guided discernment of our lives. The Second Vatican Œcumenical Council spoke of this as reading/scrutinising/examining the signs of the times through the light of the Gospel (*c.f. Gaudium et spes*, para. 4). This means that we can look again at the world in front of us through a gospel lens.

The reading from Deuteronomy for this weekend speaks of a prophet like Moses interpreting the signs and happenings of their times. What makes him a true prophet is that the words put into his mouth are the words of God. The prophet speaks truth; they see the truth; and they know the Truth.

In our daily lives we see all kinds of things which require discernment and interpretation. There are moments, even in some of the toughest times, when a little hope or charity shines through; on the other hand, in even the greatest of joys there are often hints or echoes of pain or sadness. In the greatest milestones or catastrophes of life, cracks and fractures of the known framework of being can easily show through. What if these contained opportunities to prophesy?

At baptism, the Catholic ritual has the new Christian immediately Confirmed with Sacred Chrism. The minister says: "As Christ was anointed Priest, Prophet, and King, so may you live always as a member of His body, sharing everlasting life" (Rite of Baptism for Children, [1969]1973). Being a prophet is part of Christian life.

Though the world is often divided, we need not tear ourselves from this soothing oil of salvation. The anointing of the Spirit is what sets us free from some of our worries and guides us to live with due attention given to the Lord. This anointing of the Spirit is what made Jesus speak recognisably with authority, and it is the same Spirit which helps us discern the world around us with a gospel outlook.


So, looking not to the future but to the here-and-now, the question remains: Where in your life might you be called to be prophetic?

The past year provided a challenge for our conference to be able to assist people in need due to the increase in living expenses. We conducted a total of 717 interviews during the year with people in need of food, clothing, furniture and accommodation. This was almost a 30% increase from the previous year. We are grateful to the generous support once again, from our parishioners for their donations to appeals and to the poor-box. The donations to the Christmas Hamper appeal were beyond our expectations and enabled us to help 32 families in our area. Thank you also to Frs Michael, Nathan and Brian for their support.
