# **CATHOLIC MISSION APPEAL 2020**

"For the Joy of the Lord is your Strength" Nehemiah 8:10

This weekend we welcome Emily Connors who is the Diocesan Director for Catholic Mission. Emily will speak at each Mass to highlight this year's mission theme and focus. This year's Catholic Mission Church Appeal highlights the important work of the church in Cambodia, which aims to reach out to those who have been affected by disability, and give them hope and support to live a fulfilling life.

This appeal shares the story of Chen (pictured below), a landmine survivor who lost both his legs when he was 16 years of age. Chen has been given the care and opportunity to turn this tragic event into a positive outcome through the support of the Arrupe Centre in the Apostolic Prefecture of Battambang in north-western Cambodia. Established by Bishop Enrique "Kike" Figaredo Alvargonzalez in 2001, the Arrupe Centre has evolved over the past twenty years from a short-term rehabilitation centre to a full time home for children with disability, whether it be from landmine accidents or illnesses such as polio.

As Bishop Kike says, "We are here for the common good; to be a more inclusive society and to bring also the joy of life everywhere....we look with a positive vision and, I would say, with hope and joy and happiness." The Arrupe Centre strives to show the love of God through caring for and empowering those in need.

Today, landmine accidents are still prevalent in Cambodia, a cruel reminder of the country's troubled past, even for those who were not yet born during the tumultuous years of the Khmer Rouge regime and civil conflicts that followed.

The Arrupe Centre urgently needs support to continue providing young people like Chen with opportunities so they can live a full and dignified life. The children and young people who benefit so greatly from programs like this rely on the support you can provide today.

### **RECONCILIATION OPPORTUNITY**

Following Saturday morning Mass, between **8.00am and 9.00am** on **31**<sup>st</sup> **October**, there will be an opportunity to celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation. There will be two priests available during this time. There will be the need for this to be **COVID safe event**. This requires contact tracing, wiping down of where you sit before leaving your seat to approach the priest, and again after you have completed your penance.
