

SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME [Year C] Sunday 20 February, 2022

First Reading: 1 Samuel 26:7-9 The Lord has put you in my power, but I will not raise my hand against you.

Responsorial Psalm: The Lord is kind and merciful.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:45-49 Just as we have carried the earthly image, we must carry the heavenly image.

Forgiveness – Not Vengeance

"Dead Man Walking" is a detailed eyewitness account about America's practice of punishing killing by killing – the execution of a convicted killer. The author of the book, Sister Helen Prejean, began her prison ministry in 1981 and has, over the past forty years since then, dedicated her life to poor abd broken people in New Orleans.

Helen began writing to Patrick Sonnier, who had been convicted and sentenced to death in the electric chair for killing two teenagers. From death row he asked her to visit him regularly, and she became his spiritual advisor. Her conversations with Patrick opened her eyes to the punishment process and became the basis for her book.

She has accompanied five people to death by execution and continues to this day to accompany prison inmates on death row and to counsel and walk with families of murder victims. Helen was interviewed in an ABC television program "Enough Rope" in September 2007.

A prominent Hollywood film director Tim Robbins read Helen's book, as did other directors but none of the Hollywood Studios were interested in a story about the execution of a convicted killer – he was simply getting what he deserved. They needed some romantic interest – perhaps if the nun became romantically involved with the prisoner they could do something!

But film director Tim Robbins saw it differently – this is a journey about redemption he said, about forgiveness, about rising above the destructive forces of vengeance and hatred that's so important! So the film was made: book worth reading, film worth seeing!

There is a complete reversal of the accepted world order in lots of the teachings and actions of Jesus. That's particularly true about His instructions to the disciples and to us this weekend.

"Love your enemies; do good to those who hate you; bless those who curse you; pray for those who treat you badly". "Be compassionate as your Father is compassionate; don't judge and you will not be judged; do not condemn and you will not be condemned; grant pardon and you will be pardoned'.

To Forgive the sinner, to reach out in real sincere love to our enemies is NOT to condone the sin nor pretend there is no hurt. Rather it is to <u>SET FREE</u> by attitude, by word and gentle action the person who has caused the hurt and ourselves who have been hurt. It is the *only* way to break the spiral of violence that is crushing our world. It is God's way! Fr.Hal Ranger

As you would expect, his mother Agnes died due to excessive alcoholism over a long time. Last week I spoke of Jesus giving hope to those who heard him speak and opening their hearts to thinking about how the future may in fact be more positive. Well at the end of the book Shuggie has a friend called Leanne. He met her when Agnes and him moved to London towards the end of the story. Leanne's mother is an alcoholic prostitute who she tries to support as best she can – just as Shuggie did with Agnes. Finally he has found someone who truly understands him and his motivations, his dreams and his troubled past. It ends with this hopeful note of a friendship that truly will bring a new sense of life. A lovely ending.
