November – Month of Holy Souls

Last weekend I celebrated a lovely wedding between two young people. The bride was of Indian heritage and her mother is a world renown weaver of lace. The wedding dress had a three metre long train! The beauty of the train was contained by the woven lace and the story it told of the family's journey. Within the lacework was intricate patterns from 16 countries where her mother had worked with people to produce beautiful pieces of lace. These countries included Russia, India, Slovakia, Australia, Canada and France. Each frame had a story to tell. Her mother told me of one story where the maker was a doctor's wife and he was to drive the piece to the port to be sent to Australia, but he was on call, so they sent it by ambulance! Another piece had to be smuggled out of Russia to get here! Stories within stories.

When I was thinking of the coming month, I was reflecting on the amazing story of the wedding dress and it occurred to me that part of our tradition during this time of Holy Souls is to write down the names of those who have


influenced us, and who we wish to particularly remember and honour at Eucharist. So like the wedding dress, rather then places, whose names would we choose to thoughtfully and lovingly write down as we create the beautiful story of our journey of life.

Each year you are given this opportunity to call to mind those people who have walked this journey of life with you but are now in God's kingdom.

Nature has its own cycle of life one that, as leaves and plants return to the soil they nurture new growth and bring new life to old growth. Our Christian cycle is different. We celebrate, in the month of November particularly, the acknowledgement of life that does not come to an end. In this way we, as Genesis reminds us, become the image of God, the OMEGA that exists for all time. In another way we are all like the leaves that fall from the tree of life and our gift of self to other's nurtures and renews their lives, as we hold those who have died in our hearts each day.

You are invited to write the names of those you wish to remember this month on one, or more of the leaves (on the coloured side), near the statue of St Patrick. Then place the leaf, coloured side up under the tree.

Take the time to pray in thanksgiving for the gift of the person and their eternal rest in God's loving arms. God Bless. Father Michael
