First Reading: Exodus 22:20-26 – If you are harsh with the widow or the orphan, my anger will rage against you.

Responsorial Psalm: I love you, Lord, my strength. [Psalm 17]

Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 1:5-10 – You turned away from idols to serve God and await his Son.

Gospel Acclamation: ALLELUIA! ALLELUIA! All who love me will keep my words, and my Father will love them and we will come to them. ALLELUIA!

Gospel: Matthew 22:34-40 - You shall love the Lord your God, and your neighbour as yourself.

When Father Michael invited me to express my thoughts on today's gospel reading, my initial question was how has my love of God resonated with me throughout my life, and realized it was shown to me by my parents in the way they lived their lives. I invited members of my family to share their memories of our lives, with love of God and God's love for us at the centre of our upbringing, instilled in us by our parents.......

The gospel talks of love, love your God, love your neighbour as yourself. This time of year is the anniversary of the passing of both our parents. We lost Mum in early November 2016 and Dad passed away in late October 2019. It is hard to speak of God's love and at the same time speak of the loss of our dear parents. Time eases the pain but does not heal it. Family gatherings, weddings, Christmas, are not the same without them. They remain forever in our hearts.

Mum and Dad were devoted to each other, their six children, many grandchildren and great-grandchildren. We grew up in the 60s and like a lot of families in our parish had little money (although as children we were unaware of this). Dad rode to work on a pushbike and Mum walked to town for shopping and groceries, often with kids in tow. However we never wanted for anything. They provided us with a secure house, a happy childhood and a loving home.

Jesus said His Father's house has many rooms and that He was going to prepare a place for His faithful. Mum and Dad lived the faith and we take comfort in knowing that they have earned a room in His Father's house. We pray that we can earn a place in the Father's house and be reunited with them. This is God's love.......

Initially I was asked what my idea of God was. Immediately I thought, well God is love! Simple! Then I was asked to reflect on my parents and to me I would describe them as love. Still a part of God (the human part).

Our parents were a solid stable foundation for us children to grow and flourish. They gave us stability, discipline and knowing that no matter what, we could depend and rely on their support. At times this would be hard for them but their love for us never waivered. It gave me confidence as an adult to learn new things, have adventures and have courage to face adversity. I will always be grateful that they were my parents.......

## **RECONCILIATION OPPORTUNITY**

Following Saturday morning Mass, between **8.00am and 9.00am** on **31**st **October**, there will be an opportunity to celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation. There will be two priests available during this time. There will be the need for this to be a **COVID safe event**. This requires contact tracing, wiping down of where you sit before leaving your seat to approach the priest, and again after you have completed your penance. Social distancing is also required whilst waiting to see the priest. One priest will be in the Mercy Chapel to the right of the main altar, the second will be seated to the right as you face the front doors. A similar opportunity will be offered next month.
