A Prisoner's Hope By Fhear Brian Redondo

Praise be Jesus and Mary!

One thing I like about Australia is the magnificent purple blooms of the Jacaranda Tree. Purple is the colour of the first week of Advent. The colour purple represents penance, preparation, and sacrifice. Last time, when I went back to the Philippines, I had the privilege to visit again the infamous Bilibid National Prison in Manila (thanks to the Jesuit Prison ministry) to say my thanksgiving mass inside the jail with the notorious inmates in the maximum facility. I had journeyed with them for a year as a seminarian giving liturgy of the word and listening to them. In the Jail, I realise that freedom is one of the most precious things in life that I can enjoy and live.

If there is one inspirational person that I can think about in prison, it would be **Cardinal François Xavier Nguyễn Văn Thuận**. His journey beautifully showcases the connection, between waiting, hope and faith.

Cardinal Nguyễn Văn Thuận, a Vietnamese Cardinal, endured 13 years of imprisonment where he faced isolation and uncertainty because of being a Christian. In his book titled "The Gospel of Hope; A Gospel from Prison" he shares his experiences of waiting, clinging to hope, and finding solace in the teachings of the Gospel during the darkest moments in jail.

Like us, he waited for freedom for justice for an end to his confinement. His story echoes the theme of Advent as expressed by **Isaiah's plea**; "Oh that you would rend the heavens and come down!" In his isolation Cardinal Nguyễn Văn Thuận experienced moments of despair when waiting felt almost unbearable. However his unwavering faith transformed this waiting period into an encounter with God Himself.

In our Reading today we are reminded by St. Paul that it is, through Christ Jesus that we receive God's grace.

Cardinal Nguyễn Văn Thuận despite facing challenges acknowledged the presence of grace even, within the confines of his prison cell. His book stands as a testament to how the Lord enriches and sustains us while we await the revelation of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Cardinal Nguyễn Văn Thuậns **life teaches us that waiting doesn't have to be passive; it can be a transformative process.** His profound reflections from prison remind us that like clay in the hands of a potter, we are constantly being molded by God. When we feel lost or uncertain God is at work guiding us towards ourselves.

As we journey through this season of Advent let us carry Cardinal Nguyễn Văn Thuậns spirit, within us. We should patiently wait with a sense of purpose, hope and faith trusting that as a potter molds clay, God is shaping us into vessels of His grace.
