## Toowoomba Priests' Retirement Foundation Appeal Sunday

*"At first I think it is just a sound within my dream, but slowly I realise it is the buzzing of my phone beside my bed. I look at the screen to see "No Caller ID" which I know is probably the hospital. As I answer I notice the clock shows 2am. The nurse tells me there is a lady who has had a fall and possibly a heart attack during the night and her family would like a priest to come and say some prayers. I ask for her name and say I will be right up. I thank the nurse as I call to mind the face of one of our old parishioners. As I sit on the side of the bed I recall her life. The joy she shared, the commitment she showed to the parish, the many kind acts I witnessed. I fleetingly think about life and death, how quickly it all seems to flow by. I think of the lady's family and the angst and worry that they would be experiencing. I go because I believe in the power of anointing. I go because of our shared faith in a loving God. I go because I love the people I serve. I go to bring hope and maybe a ritual of closure. As I walk to my car I see the stars and the moon in the quietness of this hour and in that hushed moment I thank God for the gift of another day."*

This could be the thoughts of any of the priests of our Diocese – past, present and those yet to be called. This weekend we take a moment to reflect on the priests we have encountered on our journey. Those we found easy to connect with, those that maybe we struggled with because they challenged us to see life differently. We most of all recall the gift they have been in their own unique ways, bringing life to our parishes, schools and communities.

Currently we have 6 retired, or semi-retired priests living in Toowoomba, and two retired Bishops living elsewhere. This appeal Sunday raises money to support not only the retired priests and Bishops but any priest who needs medical assistance that is not covered by our health fund. There is also other expenses such as rent assistance or some travel expenses, etc. The fund also covers the cost of our Clergy Nurse, Julie See, who is available for all priests for assistance medically or for transport needs, such as to and from hospitals. We thank Julie for her wonderful assistance and her joy filled nature when approaching these issues.

You will find some envelopes for donations on the tables today. Please take an envelope home and place it on the collection plate, or in the collection box next week.

There is more than just asking for a donation today. Although priests live a fairly solitary life they are always surrounded by a community in which they are involved deeply and leaving that behind can sometimes be a lonely business. Maybe it's time to reconnect with a priest that has retired, who has helped fashion and deepen your faith. Maybe this priest has walked many a mile with you. A simple phone call or dropping in to say hello can be a joy to a retired priest to chat about old times.

Please keep the retired priests in your prayers, may they find much joy in knowing that they are valued, appreciated and loved, not only for their ministry amongst us, but the unique human beings they are.
