3rd Sunday of Advent

As we move further into the mystery of Christ's Advent, I'd like to draw attention to one of the many little gems in our Sacred Liturgy. You would have noticed that when the priest prepares the gifts of bread and wine to be offered to the Father, the priest (or deacon) pours a little drop of water into the wine. While he does this, he quietly prays a beautiful little prayer: "By the mystery of this water and wine may we come to share in the divinity of Christ who humbled himself to share in our humanity." Think about these words and the action that accompanies it: When you pour a bit of water into wine, you can't get that water back out. The two mingle together and become one. This is not just a matter of watering down the wine! In this action, the two elements are totally united, symbolising the mystical unity that will be brought about between us and Jesus through our participation in the Eucharist.

I recall this particular part of the Mass because it names Jesus' first advent (his incarnation) as the foundation for our unity with him, and therefore sheds light on what Christmas is really about: "May we come to share in the divinity of Christ who humbled himself to share in our humanity." Notice it's not just about Jesus sharing our humanity as if that were simply some kind of nice novelty for the Lord. Why did he take on our humanity? So that we might take on his divinity. Have you ever considered this? – The purpose of God embracing human nature to the radical extent of the incarnation, which Christmas commemorates, is not to leave us where we are! It is to raise us up to the true dignity of what it is to be human, beyond the sinful and fallen humanity we know, to a humanity that embraces and is embraced by the divinity. In the person of the risen Jesus, we see what we are meant to be, and who we are invited to become. The beauty and glory of Christmas, then, is that by a supreme act of humility, Jesus makes himself the bridge through whom we are welcomed us back into the garden of Paradise, so to speak, where the creature walks and talks with the creator once more.

But how can we be, in a sense, 'poured into the wine', and so "share in the divinity of Christ?" Firstly, it is primarily through our Baptism and our ongoing participation in the Sacraments, especially the Eucharist, that this union between us and Jesus is established and deepened. Confession is also essential in renewing and strengthening this bond, restoring us to that relationship time and again. But the Sacraments are not magic quick fixes. How do our lives, particularly in this season of intensified Christian living, cooperate with the Sacraments of God's grace? St Paul urges us in today's second reading, "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances." These are both distinct marks of Christian holiness and means of cooperating with God's self-gift. We are called not just to say the odd prayer, but to "pray without ceasing", to be a people characterised by prayer and gratitude in all circumstances. What changes ought we make to our lives in order to prepare more fully for what God offers us this Christmas?
