### The Emmaus Story is Our Story Too

The great Desert Mother of the Early Church, Amma Theodora, tells the story of a monk 'who, because of the great number of temptations said, "I will go away from here." As he was putting on his sandals, he saw another man who was also putting on his sandals and this other monk said to him, "is it on my account that you are going away? Because I go before you wherever you are going."

Like this monk who was attempting to leave his problems behind, only to have them follow him wherever he goes, the two disciples in today's Gospel try to put Jerusalem behind them, with all the hope-crushing events that had just taken place there. 'Our own hope had been that he would be the one to set Israel free.' But now, their faces downcast, they try to make sense of what had happened. Yet in the very act of leaving behind their broken hope and disappointment, they are followed by Jesus, who was the source of their broken hope. The irony is that since 'something prevented them from recognising him,' they remained unaware that the source of their broken hope was at once the very fulfilment of that hope! They march on, their hearts burning within them, and as evening falls, they unknowingly welcome the risen Christ to stay with them. Then, something most extraordinary happens. As he breaks the bread, 'their eyes were opened and they recognised him; but he had vanished from their sight.' After all the happenings of that day, they finally catch a glimpse of reality; they catch sight of Jesus, the fulfilment of their hopes and desires amidst the shards of their broken hope. Yet at the very moment they perceive him, he vanishes. Why? Perhaps it's because once you see him, you cannot unsee him. Once you really glimpse him, you can't help but see him everywhere, in all things, and in all situations, for that hope comes to abide in our hearts.

We who live post-Easter, particularly during this Easter season, also have reason for great hope. Though our lives may be filled with real and deep disappointments, wounds, broken hopes, fears, unfulfilled desires, tragedies and heartbreaks, the risen Jesus walks at our side. Do we perceive him? Or has something prevented us from recognising him? Know that the story of the early disciples is our story, and that even while our faces are still downcast, the only one who can possibly fulfill our hopes is already right there present. Like the monk who attempted to flee from his problems, only to be followed by them, we must stay put. For we already have what we need to get through these difficult times, and he probably already abides somewhere in your heart!

### **EMMAUS**


Their backs were turned to Jerusalem the memories of that Friday too bitter. There was nothing to hold them now. They had hoped – even that was cause for sour taste. They'd given him their time left villages and families to follow; and what hurt most they'd given him their hearts. His words were strange but they had known his friendship and learned to trust even to love. But now! They walked on and he joined them. The dry dust of their journey and their hearts clouded their vision. Weighed down with loss, betrayal, fear they did not see he travelled with them. Even when he spoke recalling a history they still did not perceive. Their blind journey continued to Emmaus and could have gone beyond but for a word –a simple shattering word of invitation. 'Stay with us. The darkness is upon us.' And in the shared darkness their eyes were opened and their broken hearts healed. In memory of him became Eucharist and life to be shared with others. Surely this is Easter – not once a past event but in the darkness of our journey finding a God walking the dark ways with us into dawn.
