## Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time 4 February, 2024

**First reading:** Job 7:1-4 I am filled with sorrow all day long. **Responsorial Psalm:** Praise the Lord who heals the broken-hearted. **Second Reading:** 1 Corinthians 9:16-19 Punishment will come to me if I do not preach the Gospel. **Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia alleluia! Alleluia! He bore our sickness, and endured our suffering. Alleluia!** 

Gospel: Mark 1:29-39 He cured many who suffered from diseases of one kind or another.

**Psalm 146:1-6,** *Praise the Lord, who heals the broken-hearted.* We're in the **5th Sunday of Ordinary Time** as well as we celebrate the **Sunday of the Word of God** reflecting on the **Gospel of Mark (1:29 39)** where Jesus **cast out devils and cured many who were suffering from diseases.** Pope Francis highlights the intention for February, which **focuses on those who are terminally ill and their significant others.** We pray for them to receive the proper care and support they need.

The Gospel showcases a situation were individuals, led by their loved ones approach Jesus in the afternoon. As the desert heat eased, it became possible for their loved ones to help them after a productive day. No longer facing desperation, they found consolation in someone who could relieve and heal their sickness and loose them from challenges. With hope, Jesus devoted his night to healing and comforting people making sure that the following days would be filled with light.

Contemplating Pope Francis's words "Cure if it is possible; always take care." I reminisce about my time as a seminarian when I used to do pastoral care for the sick and hospital visits at a geriatric health facility. Sister Teresa, a nurse, with dedication, introduced me to the concept of "sundowning" among individuals suffering from dementia. At nightfall, some patients appear increased confusion, anxiety and restlessness. These are any possible causes: They're exhausted at day's end; they get confused when day-shift nurses disappear, and a different set of faces comes for night-shift; their daytime medications wear off.

I came to understand that sundowning is not only for the grannies & grandads; we have all experienced it somehow. During our moments of sundowning we long, for the safety of the day and kindness of individuals. The Gospel beautifully displays this concept where the sick, the possessed, and the weary approach Jesus during the calm of twilight. Jesus remains awake throughout the night to make certain they no longer fear the darkness.

As Pope Francis emphasises the relevance of communion within our parishes let us apply this principle in our lives. **Communion has the power to transform strangers into friends.** Through our shared faith that is **Christ-centred**, we become brothers and sisters who can find unity amidst disagreements, diversity, and differences. Our Australian values resonate very well on *"freedom, respect, fairness and equality of opportunity as central to the community remaining a secure, prosperous and peaceful place to live. Our values define and shape our country."* 

As intended by Pope Francis, our universal church leads to the synodal way, reaching our sense of community beyond church doors to include those in our peripheries. With that said I uplift you to reflect on the concept of sundowning in your life. Have you witnessed someone close to you – perhaps your parents experiencing sundowning? As we navigate through our evening and nightfall, let us always remember the consoling image of Jesus from the Gospel, staying awake all night with those who are in need.

I echo Pope Francis's call for prayers and dedication towards those who are terminally ill and their families. Let us strive to follow the compassion of Jesus offering not only assistance but also genuine care and support.
