

First reading: Genesis 12:1-4 The call of Abraham, the father of God's people. **Responsorial Psalm:** Lord, let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in you. **Second Reading:** 2 Timothy 1:8-10 God has saved us, and called us to be holy.

Transfiguration / Metamorphosis

What if we, too, were transfigured?

Early in my English literature studies, they introduced us to *Metamorphosis* (*Die Verwandlung*) by Franz Kafka (1915). The story covers the sad end of its protagonist, Gregor Samsa, who wakes up one morning to find himself changed into a giant insect. As one could but imagine, this was rather a shock to his family. It also meant he was unable to work, unable even to roll over, and eventually unable to gain the sustenance required for life.

It's a kind of horrible story with a (spoiler alert!) tragic end; certainly not the kind of transformation that I would like to happen to me. Yet the work did capture my attention. This speculative narrative challenged me to think about how we all change through life. Not only the idea of change – also what effect this has on the ways we might function, our relationships, how we are seen by others, and from where and what we draw life.

The Transfiguration of Jesus shows us something quite different to the metamorphosis of Gregor Samsa. Here, Jesus' clothes became radiant, His place among the law and the prophets was explicit, and His relationship with the Father proclaimed for those present to witness. Peter reacts in an almost Kafka-esque way with surprise. But he also makes mistake of thinking that the transfiguration should stay as it is.

What kind of metamorphosis are we experiencing this Lent? It's meant to be a time of growing towards the life of Easter, a light glimpsed at the transfiguration. We certainly hope not to undergo the transfiguration(/metamorphosis) of Gregor.

Yes, the change we undergo in Lent will affect our relationships, even with our families. It should change the way we engage with our work every single day. But it shouldn't stop us from being able to turn toward the light, correct our ways, and convert. And it should bring us closer to Jesus who is the way, the truth, and the life.

I wish you every peace and blessing on your metamorphosis this week!
