## Remembering Fr. Brian Sparksman DCL composed by life long friend, Gabrielle Saide.

I first met Fr Brian in 1971 when his first appointment was to Holy Name Parish. I was an active member of the Legion of Mary at the Cathedral and Fr Brian was the Spiritual Director of the Holy Name Praesidium. I soon learnt that he wanted to move the Church along after the Vatican Council and that appealed to me. I had a real thirst for renewal as I had left school in 1964 just as some English was being introduced into our celebration of Mass. I hungered to know more about Vatican II.

A man of great faith, Fr Brian loved the Scriptures and the Prayer of the Church. Whilst at Holy Name the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults commenced in the parish, the first in the diocese. Fr Brian promoted this process with great enthusiasm. During his time at Holy Name, Fr Brian was a regular visitor to our home and became a family friend. Fr Brian made numerous friends at Holy Name, including the Sarquis family who "adopted" him after his parents and brother Charles went to their eternal reward. In 1977 Fr Brian went to study Canon Law at the Catholic University of America in Washington DC. He was awarded his Doctorate in 1980 for a thesis entitled *Music in the Western Church.* Whilst studying in Washington he made many more friends, including Bishop Brian Finnigan.

In 1981 he was appointed Director of the Marriage Tribunal and went back to live at Holy Name. He was appointed Diocesan Chancellor in 1988 and fulfilled that role with great integrity until 2014. He was a great mentor to many people who were going through difficult times including some priest friends. As Diocesan Archivist, I worked under Fr Brian in the Marian Centre from 2002. Together with the other staff morning tea was a *must* and no excuse was needed for cake, conviviality and great conversation on church matters and many other topics. Fr Brian will be remembered for his great love and thirst for Christian Unity and was the driving force behind the Ecumenical and Interfaith Movement in this diocese. Fr Brian loved a party and always celebrated in style. His significant birthdays and jubilees began with Mass, followed by fine food and wine at various locations in the country between here and Warwick.

A victim of polio whilst at Downlands College in 1951 but recovering to the extent where he could walk with a caliper, Fr Brian never let this disability stop him from doing anything in life. He was stoic and determined. Travel was in his blood and travel he did, overseas and within Australia. He organized many of these trips with the assistance of Mrs Millicent Smith. He travelled to England and Ireland with cousins to pursue his love of family history and co-authored family history books. Fr Brian's forebears worked on Glengallon Homestead. In later years he joined the Glengallon Historical Society and put his love of history to work by helping in their Archives every Monday. His love of his home parish church at Deuchar never wavered.

Fr Brian's love of classical music led him to many of the great opera houses and concert halls overseas and in Australia. He was gifted with a beautiful singing voice and whilst at the seminary studied voice at the Queensland Conservatorium of Music. When chaplain at Lourdes Home from March 1994 he made many friends amongst the staff, two of whom took him shopping every



Christmas to buy presents for his family, staff and friends. His Christmas card list was a force to be reckoned with. I have found it difficult to encapsulate in a few words the priest and friend I have known for over 50 years. This is the Brian I knew and had the fortune to know and work with in many aspects of church life. *May he rest in eternal peace with the God he loved.*
