THIRTY SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

6 November 2022

First Reading: 2 Maccabees 7:1-2 The king of the world will receive us into lifeeternal at the resurrection.

Responsorial Psalm: Lord, when your glory appears, my joy will be full.

Second Reading: Alleluia, alleluia! Jesus Christ is the firstborn of the dead; glory and kingship be his for ever and ever.

Alleluia!

Gospel: Luke 20: 27-38 He is not a God of the dead but of the living.

Memento mori

It is said that we do not, in fact, struggle primarily with faith; often, we struggle in a crisis of hope. While small experiences of life taunt us to despair or threaten us with doubt, nothing hits as hard as death. Beginning with All Saints which we celebrated this past week, followed with the Commemoration of All Souls, we have entered November facing the reality of death for all it can be – all that *faith* suggests it can be, *love* longs it to be, and that *hope* demands it to be.

November is, as it were, a valley of bones (as the prophet Ezekiel would say) through which we walk with the Lord. Not the dry bones that will decay and collapse with time but dry bones which form the skeleton of work which the Lord fulfils. In the face of death, and in the face of all that is broken, dying, or decayed in our own lives, the Lord is the light and salvation; hope is in the Lord.

Throughout Christian history, art has almost always included some symbol to remind us that death is not only a part of our experience of life as loved ones go ahead of us but it is also something in store for all of us. We can only stand to face this reality and be reminded of it because our Christian hope allows us to trust that, in passing through death, life is change not ended.

This November at the Cathedral, we are using the symbol of a tree with fallen leaves as our reminder of death (Latin 'Memento mori'). If we can lean into this reality and learn to face it in hope, the world will come to know that a great prophet indeed has appeared among us. I invite you to participate in this prayer experience by writing the name of a deceased loved one on one of the leaves provided and placing it under tree.

For this month of the holy souls, we can turn again with hope to the grief, loss, memories and unfulfilled dreams with which we treasure our faithful departed. We look at them in *faith*, and we cherish them in *love*, but we hold them in the *hope* promised us.
