VIA ET VERITAS ET VITA - THE WAY, AND THE TRUTH, AND THE LIFE


What does heaven look like? What is this eternal-life promised by the resurrection of Jesus? We heard last week that Jesus was sent (and came) that we might have life – not just life but life in its fullness. This week, looking toward our final destination, we see what that means for the here-and-now.

Jesus as the Way: This starts off quite straightforward. Without diminishing Him to a model of good behaviour, Jesus is often presented as a role-model. He shows the way to live by word and example; He invites us into relationship with the Father; He does works of charity, and shows mercy at every turn.

Jesus as the Truth: Here things get a bit fascinating for me. It's all well and good to think of objective truth, but it's not so easy to ground it. I often make the mistake of assuming 'truth' is some ultimately-provable hypothesis, like from the scientific method. Yet looking back, and in the context of what Jesus is saying, it might just be more than that. Seeing that the Greeks attributed truth to one of their goddesses (*Aletheia*; also honoured as a virtue by the Latins), He might be referring to a Truth that is known more than simply head knowledge. It has to take body; it can't stay in the head or as an elusive idea.

Jesus is the Life: He laid down His own life so that others may live; was born into human life so that we might be raised to the divine (*c.f.* Clement of Alexandria); the Church is the living body of Christ; just like Jesus, through the Holy Spirit, we can participate in the life God promises.

So, back to the initial question: what does heaven look like? What is this place where Jesus is going to prepare for us? Well, ... what can we tell from the above? The Way tells us something about the destination; the Truth is something we strive to bring from an idea to a reality; and the Life we live now is the Kingdom of God that awaits and longs for the eternity-life prepared for us. Every blessing and much cheer as you continue your journey through the Easter Season, longing for our heavenly home. *NPW*

COMMUNION FROM THE CUP Now that the Cup has been reintroduced for Communion at all Sunday Masses, it is timely to remind everyone of the standard Communion protocols. In the first instance, the Host is taken on the hand and *consumed immediately*. If a person wishes to partake of the Cup, they move to the Communion Minister holding the cup. The person takes the Cup as it is offered, then returns the Cup to the minister, who will then wipe the rim thoroughly turning the Cup a quarter, before handing the Cup to the next communicant. PLEASE NOTE: Intinction is *not* permitted – that is, it is not appropriate to hold onto the Host and intinct (dip) it into the Cup.
