Pastoral Care – An Ecumenical Approach

Members of the Pastoral Care team at Toowoomba Base Hospital offer with respect - emotional, pastoral, practical, sacramental, and spiritual support to patients, families, friends and staff. Pastoral Care engages in actively listening to another, validating their feelings and seeking to explore meaning and hope. I have been a Pastoral Carer at the Base Hospital in Toowoomba since 2014 making myself available to visit all denominations and those with no God connection or belief. I visit at the Base Hospital in Acute Mental Health Unit (Bamal, Jarrowair), Adolescent Inpatient Unit (Yannanda), Medical Unit 3 (MU3), Regional Cancer care (6D) as well as the wards at Baillie Henderson Hospital (Ridley Unit, Conolly Unit, Giabal Unit and Jacaranda Unit).

I distribute Communion and pastorally visit at St Vincent's Aged Care Toowoomba (Lourdes Home for Aged) in Bishop Brennan Wing (BBW) and Transitional Care Program (TCP).

It continually amazes me the amount of pain and suffering each of us carry around as baggage. When we are well the load is not always a big drag on us but when our health (physical/mental) starts to fail the baggage draws us into the depths of depths. Compassion, empathy and silent listening have been my sustaining strength.

Who would have thought ten years ago you would see me in this role of journeying with patients in the messiness of their lives. Like

- Affirming by the practice of silence the pain being endured by a patient.
- Holding an aged patient's hand as they go to eternal life.
- Praying with patients to their/my God about pain, suffering, terminal diagnosis.
- Battling with mental illness and drug addiction.
- Being stuck in the rut of having committed the 'unforgiveable' sin.
- Bringing Christ in the Eucharist to their bedside and allowing him to work his magic.
- Hearing the stories of abuse, assault, power control and unbelievable pain.
- Raising a smile on a patient's face when they are having a down day.
- Listening to a patient tell me what sustains them at this time of pain and suffering.
- Being able to supply basic clothes/underwear to satisfy a basic human need.
- Being able to give parents witness and affirm the life lost in a still birth.

In all these interactions I am sustained by my loving God and given comfort by him and my fellow Pastoral Carers.

I constantly pray for the answers to two questions I ask about each Pastoral visit.

Where is God in the messiness of this patient's pain and suffering?

What is God trying to teach me from this encounter?

On reflection my Pastoral Care journeying has moved me closer to a better understanding of who my God is and my journey to him.
