## TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 9 October 2022

First Reading: 2 Kings 5:14-17 Naaman returned to Elisha, the prophet, and acknwledged the Lord.
Responsorial Psalm: The Lord has reveled to the nations his saving power. [Psalm 97]
Second Reading: 2 Timothy 2:8-13 If we hold firm, we shall reign with Christ.

Alleluia, alleluia! For all the things give thanks to God, because this is what he expects of you in Christ Jesus. Alleluia! Gospel: Luke 17:11-19 It seems that no one has returned to give thanks to God except this foreigner.

## Beginning and End



Featured on altarpieces throughout the world are the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet: *Alpha* (A /  $\alpha$ ) and *Omega* ( $\Omega$  /  $\omega$ ). We are familiar with the first when we speak of 'alpha males', and it is compatible with our own modern English alphabet letter -A-; and we are familiar with the latter more recently with the *omicron* variant of the coronavirus.



But what do they mean for us as people of faith? For many of us the letters of the Greek alphabet would have little or no relevance to our everyday life. Except for the occasional addition of crumbly feta cheese to my meals, the most I have to do with Greece is its ancient history and philosophers.

These symbols have been used since the early Church; "I am the Alpha and the Omega," (Rev 1:8 & 22:13) has been a source of symbolism and art for centuries. There are many examples, but notable among them is a *sarcophagus* (coffin) from antiquity ( $3^{rd}-4^{th}$  c.) now in the Louvre in Paris [pictured below]. The monogram of Christ (formed by overlapping the first two letters – *chi* and *rho* (XP) – of the Greek word XPI $\Sigma$ TO $\Sigma$  – *Christos* – Christ) stands at the centre, with the *alpha* to the left and the *omega* to the right. The rest of the carving depicts vines and branches, driving home the message of life in Christ. Thus, the stone burial container is decorated with a strong theological statement of life beginning in Christ and ending with His eternal life.

Not many of us will be planning funerals this week, but the symbolism of this coffin can still be helpful for us. We can think about putting God at the beginning and end of our days; we can pray and ask God for things but then remember to thank Him and praise Him for the good things that He's given us – like the one grateful leper in the gospel accounts today.

With God at the beginning of this week, I hope and pray that His grace will sustain you to its very end.
