To Chase the Monsters Away.....

James Blunt released a beautiful and moving song, in October 2019, titled "Monsters". It is a song borne out of his own life experience involving his father, for it mirrors some of his own fears, but also his hopes for growth in the years to come. His father is suffering from a serious health condition and requires a kidney transplant urgently. Both James and his sister have offered but they are not compatible, so his father is waiting and due to his advanced age is not high on the transplant list. James fears that his father will die before he is able to receive a new kidney.



The words of the chorus are:

"I'm not your son, you're not my father, we're just two grown men saying goodbye. No need to forgive, no need to forget, I know your mistakes and you know mine, and while you're sleeping, I'll try to make you proud. So daddy, won't you just close your eyes? Don't be afraid, it's my turn to chase the monsters away."

In the context of the gospel today, it reminds us of what it means to have people who are the light for us in our lives. People that God has given to us to help fashion our lives. For some people, when asked, "Who lights your way?", they may immediately say their parents or family, but for others life is more complicated and their experience is different. However for everyone there is someone who God has gifted us with to guide our way and be that light for us in our dark times. The funny thing about life though is God can be quite subtle and often goes about inspiring us without us really noticing until we reflect back upon our living. When I was going to school at St. John's in Roma I would often be late home from school. The hospital was only a few blocks from St. John's and I had visited with my parents some of the senior people in the Nursing Home part, called Westhaven. So when I was in High School, I used to head up there once or twice a week. I can still remember those I visited – Mrs Hartley, who I used to take out in her wheelchair for a walk around the grounds, Mr. Gimbert who used to wait for me at the front entrance and was very deaf, Mr Parker who used to live down the street from our home and so on. These people used to regale me with stories of the past, have a laugh, a cry when things were tough and give me a wonderful sense of companionship and friendship. To me this is God providing light for my days, salt for preservation of spirit. When I look back now I can see that this experience over many years fashioned my character and faith in a way that still remains with me. So people who show us Christ's light can come in many different forms, over different times, and through different faces. For James Blunt, it is about acknowledging the mistakes that both his father and himself have made over a lifetime and saying "that's ok" we are at peace together now. It's about receiving enough love that when he's on his own, he can be the light for others so he can "chase the monsters away" too - even his own.

Thank you God for all those people in our lives who have been the light of Christ for us, and the salt that has helped preserve the knowledge of God's goodness within us.
