PALM SUNDAY - Year C - Saturday 13 April/Sunday 14 April 2019

First Reading: Isaiah 50:4-7 – I did not cover my face against insult and I know I will not be

ashamed.

Responsorial Psalm: My God, my God, why have you abandoned me? [Psalm 21]

Second Reading:

Phil 2:6-11 – He humbled himself to become like us and God raised him on high.

Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ, king of endless glory! Christ became obedient

for us even to death, dying on the cross. Therefore God raised him on high and gave him a name above all other names. Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ, king of

endless glory!

Gospel: Luke 22:14 – 23:56 – *The passion of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.*

The BIG WEEK – HOLY WEEK: The Gospels provide a lot of detail about the experiences, words and actions of Jesus during the final days before His death. In many ways those events sum up His Ministry 2000 years ago in Israel: celebrating and to some extent re-living the events is an annual renewal of our commitment to the things that really matter. We'll gather this weekend as usual on four occasions to commemorate Jesus' entry into the city of Jerusalem to celebrate the Passover feast of that final year. No grandstanding about the entry, not what many in His time were expecting from the Messiah, no free Israel from Roman occupation... rather a simple country man from Nazareth riding a donkey. But the ordinary people responded, spontaneously tearing branches from the palm trees, laying them in His path and singing Hosanna! Our re-enactment before each Mass will invite us to re-live this event. And importantly this year the special blessing of palms will take place on the eastern lawn by the Cathedral with our sisters and brothers from the Anglican, Lutheran and Uniting church communities in Toowoomba. We'll sing boldly and loudly our hymns of praise and hopefully we'll be more faithful and genuine disciples than so many in those original crowds turned out to be. Then into the week – recalling and exploring the meaning of events that happened [and still happen] the following days:

- He goes to the Temple to pray and angered by what He finds, overturns the trading tables "My house shall be called a house of prayer: you are making it a den of robbers." But His message went much deeper than the expulsion of the money merchants!
- He goes out of Jerusalem to the nearby village of Bethany to share a meal with friends... and the crowds follow, believers and harsh critics, and He allows Himself to be anointed with precious oil. We'll reflect upon anointing and its significance on Monday evening during the 5.30pm Chrism Mass.
- The enthusiasm of the crowds builds: and the determination of the Jewish religious leaders to get rid of Jesus hardens. Judas takes the offer to betray Him out of greed, self-interest, confusion! Just like us sometimes!! And we come to the Big three days: Try to be part of the action on next Thursday evening at 7pm here in St Pat's. This is the Eucharist that provides the lens into understanding every Eucharist and into understanding what is involved in living in communion together with Jesus.
- o It is full of the memory of the Passover of Israel [and each of us] from slavery into freedom.
- o There's the powerful sign of service where the leader washes the servants' feet.
- There's the ever-new experience of breaking and pouring out, eating and drinking, absorbing the Spirit of Jesus together.
- And finally an opportunity to remain in silence after a movement from the table to a quieter place, to remember
 His agony and fear, our agonies and fears, His loneliness and ours for as long as we wish, into the night.
 Thence to Good Friday:
- At 10am to follow the journey to Calvary, the way of the Cross.
- At 3pm to hear again the details of a mock trial, to walk in our minds and hearts that frightening, painful journey, carrying His cross and our crosses together. Time to pray for each other and our world. Time to venerate the symbol of suffering, dying and hope that is the cross. Finally to enter again into Communion with Him and one another and move home quietly to reflect and rest, becoming ready to embrace a new beginning at Easter of our lives IN CHRIST.
