from the dead.

Responsorial Psalm: This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad. [Psalm 117] **Second Reading:** Colossians 3:1-4 – *Look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is.*

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! Christ has become our paschal sacrifice; let us feast with joy in

the Lord. Alleluia!

Gospel: John 20:1-9 – The teaching of scripture is that he must rise from the dead.

CELEBRATE THE RESURRECTION

Love has triumphed over hatred......" If they kill me, I shall rise in the [Salvadoran] people. If the threats come to be fulfilled, from this moment I offer my blood to God for the redemption and resurrection of El Salvador. Let my blood be a seed of freedom and the sign that hope will soon be a reality" (St Oscar Romero) Jesus the one who raised the weak...... It was a woman, not the leadership of the church that discovered the empty tomb. It was the weaker one, as seen in the society of the time, who moved first and led the supposedly stronger one to the truth. It is often like this. The helpless child makes the parent generous, the handicapped makes the healthy helpful, the needy make the better off merciful and the deceased make us live a better life. Let us proclaim the love of the risen Christ who has triumphed, not the hatred that brings about wars and enemies. Have a peaceful and joyful Easter, Fr. Nandana

St Paul sums it all up clearly -

"If Christ were not raised from death then our faith is futile;

but in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of all those who have died!"

To believe that Jesus is risen is to believe that when we've worked it all out, Jesus is the point where all human histories converge. In fully embracing human nature Jesus gives a new dignity to every human and assures us all of an eternal destiny. In Christ and through Christ something has happened within history that alters forever what is possible. Death remains real but "it" has also been overcome, conquered. God has much much more to offer when we have run out of energy and come to the end of our resources. We die, having one way or another poured out our life in this world, then God re-makes us. God raises us to new life, a fuller never ending life, just as God raised Jesus. Today we celebrate not only an "isolated miracle" of 2000 years ago, but a present reality. It's a reality that orders and organises our life together as Christians, life in the Body of Christ, wherein there is hope and faithfulness, unending love and mercy - life forever.

Tell me, where have you put him?

One of my favourite jokes for Easter is the story of the man fishing at a certain river. Another man approaches him and says, "I am a fisheries inspector and I happen to notice your bucket of fish. I have to inform you that you are fishing out of season and most of those fish appear to be undersize." To which the fisherman replies, "Ah, you don't understand these are my pet fish. Every Sunday I take these fish down here to the river for a swim. I release them and after a while I let out a whistle and they come back to shore and I gather them up and take them back to their pond in my backyard. In fact we were just about to head home" The inspector is amazed and immediately requests to see such a thing. "Sure" says the fisherman and promptly empties the bucket of fish into the river. After a little time has passed the inspector says, "Mate, are you going to whistle those fish back?" To which the fisherman replies, "What fish?" Like todays story of the resurrection, we might say, "Where is the evidence?" An empty tomb is all we have to see! The evidence of the resurrection is, like Mary realised, right in front of our eyes! Jesus' tomb becomes the hidden place where our saviour dwells within us, so the tomb leads to a temple and that temple is our very selves. Every time we forgive, uplift, gently challenge, bring joy, celebrate life, love, bring peace — and live in the light, we reveal the risen Christ to those around us. So let us STAND UP and be the true temple of the risen Christ and allow the light to shine from us NOW AND ALWAYS! May you have a blessed, uplifting and fulfilling Easter time and may you find joy in the gift of this time of journey!
