Temples and Cathedrals

Never a day goes by without someone, often a family, stopping by to visit our Cathedral, open as you know, all day every day. The sight of the building, the quietness within, the reminders of God, the Tabernacle, altar, statues, stations, the place of Baptism, the burial place of Denis Fouhy...all combine to awaken the Spirit within the visitor. For many visitors and locals of course there's more! They come to remember...a wedding 50 years ago, the place of their Baptism, to recall a parent's funeral, to pray again in a familiar place.

The Cathedral is, of course, primarily a place of prayer, a quiet place to be open to God and listen; a space for groups both small and large to listen to God's word, to be embraced by God's love, to celebrate Sacraments, especially Eucharist each day.

These thoughts and the day to day experience from which they flow are being especially highlighted this weekend:

- al Because the Gospel we'll listen to this weekend is part of Jesus' reflection at an annual feast in Jerusalem commemorating the Dedication of their Temple and recalling the famous original Temple built by Solomon and the restoration of the Temple following Israel's return from exile in Babylon. The feast celebrated God's special presence among them in the grand structure and God's dwelling within the hearts of His chosen people. Jesus invites His listeners to embrace God's presence, in a new and deeper way, by LISTENING to the voice of His teaching about a God of faithful love, by embracing His way of living and dying, by being open to His Spirit and Rising to new life. The voice that is not just a sound from His mouth but everything about Him - His way of living, His loving, His teaching, His dying, His being raised to life.
- b] Something quite extraordinary is happening right now in Europe that also speaks to us of Temples and Cathedrals. A few weeks ago, Monday 15th April, there was a terrible fire in the heart of Paris. This accidental fire caused severe damage to Notre Dame Cathedral and brought about deep heartache in France and beyond. It seemed like the death of a very old and dear friend, who had seen everything, heard everything, felt everything, forgiven everything involved in the life of Paris and France for the past 850 years!

Notre Dame reminds the French people of who they are and what France is...and that means Catholic in the best sense of the word, standing for Faith despite the Reformation, the age of Enlightenment, world wars...

Jesus continues to speak through our Cathedral, through Notre Dame in Paris, through the Temple in Jerusalem. He speaks Words of Life and Mercy, to lift up our hearts beyond selfishness. Our buildings are sacred signs of His presence among us!
