Celebrating the Body and Blood of Christ - EVERY DAY!


When we think of this feast day, we often only think of the sacrament of the Eucharist. This weekend more than 50 young ones receive the sacrament for the first time in their lives. They know also that the presence of Christ is much more than this experience today. The picture below is from a series of books that were popular many years ago – *"The Coles Funny Picture Book"*. An endless source of amusement, filled with amusing stories, pictures and rhymes. One of my favourite pictures was always the one below. Hidden in the forest is a horse, a camel, an elephant, a giraffe, a kangaroo and a monkey.

Some people will say they are easy to find, but some will struggle! The clue of course, is to sit and look for awhile and the hidden pictures will reveal themselves. The other option is to ask someone else if they can see them, and together you will make the discovery. So seeking the Body of Christ every day is also our task! It is often hidden in plain sight also!

We meet many people who we like and enjoy their company – we know their goodness and love – easy to see and feel the presence of Jesus within them. When we meet others, they seem to "rub" us the wrong way – their way of life clashes with our own – they demand too much from us – we disagree with everything they say – their attitude seems far from holy! These times it is a little harder to recognise the Jesus within – but he is there! Like the picture below, sometimes we have to look deeper and more carefully, and sometimes it takes time to see Jesus' presence. Bishop Bill Morris used a phrase once that has always stayed with me – "The closest you will get to Jesus today, is the person you are sitting beside!" That can be a big challenge in itself. We sometimes forget that the experience of one person and ourselves, can be vastly different when that person is encountered by someone else. That's when we need to ask another, so that we too can discover the hidden Christ in the other.

Take a moment to hold in your heart those people who reveal Jesus to you.....then also take a moment to look deeply at those you find difficult in your life....ask God to reveal the hidden Jesus within them.

So, like the gospel reading today of the feeding of the five thousand, may we, as the body of Christ, respond generously to the challenge, "*Give them something to eat yourselves*" when Jesus stirs within our hearts!
