Mary, Martha and Pope Francis In the story we hear this weekend concerning the activities of Mary and Martha we are drawn into a certain

tension that is evident. The tension between prayer and action. With a very clever literary twist this story is placed between two significant signposts - last week we heard the story of good actions - the parable of the good Samaritan - next week we learn how to pray when Jesus introduces the prayer we know as the Lord's Prayer. Mary and Martha act as a literary segue between the two instructions. This tension we identify within the story – prayer and action – we know deep within ourselves. There is a great interplay in our lives between the two, and each has an influence upon the other. Our actions are authenticated by prayer and our prayer is authenticated by action. The tension is about living truthfully God's calling of each of us. In a recent homily, Pope Francis said "There are many people around Jesus who search for God, but the most prodigious reality is that, long before that, in the first place there is God, who is concerned about our life, who wants to raise it, and to do this, God calls us by name, recognising the individual face of each person. Each person is a love story that God writes on this earth. Each one of us is God's love story. God calls each of us by name: God knows us by name; God looks at us; God waits for us; God forgives us; God is patient with us" Today we are simply challenged the think about our actions and how deeply we authenticate them with prayer. Recently, as you can see below, the Bishops of Australia were invited to the Vatican. This occurs every four years throughout the world. Bishop Robert was keen to share the beauty of this visit. To me, Pope Francis is leading with example which is borne simply from experience and prayer leading to practical and loving action. Bishop Robert was saying that the Bishops were told before they entered the room that there was to be no genuflecting, no kissing of the papal ring, and they could leave there Zucchetto's on. Now for those who are unfamiliar with Bishop's fashion the Zucchetto is the cap that Bishops wear to signify their position within the church hierarchy. As you can see the Pope wears a white zucchetto. So in essence the Pope is

simply saying "Today we meet as equals — I just happen to be Bishop of Rome" Protocol normally requires Bishops to remove their zucchettos in the presence of the Pope.

Pope Francis spent two and a half hours in audience with the Bishops of Australia — he invited them into a conversation.

He didn't dictate or demand anything from them. The time was spent listening and asking questions, and I am sure encouraging the Bishops. Bishop Robert said at one stage Pope Francis got up and poured a glass of water and gave it to the translator. A very authentic act! The most significant, and I am sure unheard before, is Pope Francis saying, "If you have any criticisms of me, or of what I do — say it now to my face, don't say it out there, say it now!"
