Before my priestly ordination in July, it was with joy and excitement that I received word from Bishop McGuckin that I would be coming to serve St Patrick's Cathedral as assistant priest. During those years I acquired a growing thirst for scripture, theology and literature, as well as a deepening love for Jesus and prayer, which I consider the centre of my life. Besides reading, I enjoy sport (especially running and rugby league) and I also have an interest in languages. I've felt very welcomed already by Fr Michael and the Cathedral staff, and I'm eager to get to know you all and work with you over the coming months and years, as well as the parishioners of St Thomas Moore's Parish.
