Gospel: Luke 17:11-19 [Jesus heals ten men]

Healing comes in many ways...

Some three years ago my mother, Mona, passed away, and my father, Kevin, had died some 11 years prior. In 2017 the eight of us, and spouses went out to Roma to celebrate a Mass in the cemetery and to bless Mum's headstone. It was a wonderfully uplifting and strengthening time for our family. We felt very close to each other as we spent time remembering our parents and how they live on in our daily lives and especially in the way we "do" things. We all went out for dinner and continued to share stories and thoughts with much laughter and fun. During that night we decided that we need to simply be together as a family each year. We came to the conclusion that it was not good enough to say "We'll catch up at birthday parties", as at most parties you spend time talking to others you haven't seen for ages etc. We decided this was our time as family to talk. A time to have a great laugh and enjoy each other's company, but just as important is to take a little time to talk about anything that is seriously affecting our lives, or will in the future. Last year we went to the Bunya Mountains and this year we are going to Noosaville. During my time at St. Mary's at Goondiwindi my family visited on a fairly regular basis, especially Mum and Dad. The gift from the community at my farewell was a fully paid week at Laguna Resort at Noosaville – they even paid extra for Sr. Rosie to be there! A thoughtful and welcome gift that cemented our family gathering for this year.

So....when we think about today's gospel - what *were* the reasons for the one man to return to thank Jesus in today's gospel:

- To thank Jesus for the healing;
- To follow Jesus into the future;
- To join others that have the same spirit;
- To be part of something greater than himself;
- To belong to a group where he sometimes felt an outsider;
- To bring the joy of life he felt to others;
- To be open to challenge and other ways of looking at life;
- Because there was an awareness this encounter was life giving.

I wonder whether this is all that far from the reasons we, as a family, gather? As most families we don't always agree, and often are challenged by the way other family members seem to see the world, but life is often about challenge and being open and willing to seeing things from someone else's life viewpoint. So healing isn't always a physical matter and maybe the thanksgiving of the man in the gospel is much more



about spiritual healing and wellbeing of the mind, than anything else. We are also called to be thankful for wherever we find healing for "our weary souls". Those are the people we need to spend time with. Thank you for the part you – St Patrick's Community play in this area for me - for your support over these 15 months and I will see you in three weeks – refreshed! **God Bless.
