Readings this weekend:

First Reading: Exodus 17:8-13 Responsorial Psalm: Our help is from the Lord, who made heaven and earth. [Psalm 120] Second Reading: 2 Timothy 3:14 – 4:2 Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! The word of God is living and active; it probes the thoughts and motives of our heart. Alleluia! Gospel: Luke 18:1-8

There are many things going on when we pray.

- We ask God to fulfil our dreams, often we tell God what we want for ourselves or for others based on <u>our</u> limited but urgent idea of what should happen: that's usually me-centred.
- Often our focus is on thanking God for what has happened or what is happening to ourselves or others: at its best that's God-centred.
- Often we are saying "sorry" to God for words and actions that one way or another involved turning our back on God or on other people. Failing to share with others by word and/or action the gifts of life and love God has given us.
- And sometimes our praying is totally God-centred: we stand [or sit or kneel] in awe, in adoration, in admiration, in worship of our God who is "All in All." And we listen!

Those "me-centred" prayers make little sense when we step back and consider. After all, God knows what we need without our asking, and God alone knows what is best for ourselves and for those for whom we are asking. Yet, prayers of asking are the kind that Jesus often recommends and what we call the "Lord's Prayer" includes this asking. So we should persevere with them. Whatever else may result from our telling God what to do [even if we phrase the words to look like humble requests] we do embrace the experience of turning to the "One Who Is", the God of all life and love, Our Father/Mother/Creator and opening our hearts.

Those who are blessed with self-confidence, and especially those in a position and of a mind to exercise power in this world, may see no need to turn to God in prayer. And, likewise, only those who can honestly acknowledge their lack of power, their "littleness" will turn to God. In that honest realisation lies the starting point for all listening to and speaking with God.

People from all walks of life, people in all kinds of situations come to realise their own littleness and then come to lay themselves open to the gifts God offers, <u>whatever those gifts may be</u>.

Opening our hearts to God's call, presence, gifts, challenges, opportunities, is the initial step in faith. And mysteriously faith and trust and confidence in God grow the more we allow God to be in charge. Listening to what God is saying to us, of course, will always be more important than what we say to God!
