Gospel: Luke 21:5-19 [The End Times]


Take/Make Time.....

This lovely prayer card was held lovingly in my mother's Mass book for many years. It was a little reminder to take a little time each day to consider the beauty of living. To remember what is important and what our actions evoke in us. When reading today's gospel we might think that the end times are upon us already – wars, earthquakes, famines, violence and oppression! We are challenged to not give into these thoughts, but rather trust in a God that will not abandon us. We are invited rather to turn to prayer – for strength of faith, to see the goodness that is sometimes hidden, to strive to be that goodness for others.

As we approach Advent we are invited to commit ourselves to a deeper search for our relationship with God that is beyond the disturbances of the world today. That requires us to "TAKE TIME" or in our busy world it really means to "MAKE TIME". I invite you to seriously consider what you will do during this Advent to walk with a God that is already by your side – to build a place in your day to see God in all things. This is an opportunity not to be missed, for you may not get another.

Challenge yourself to commit to a "way of prayer" this Advent!

Here are a couple of starting points.....



Lectio Divina is a way of contemplating and internalising a scripture passage. After taking a moment of quiet, read slowly and attentively a short piece of scripture, such as a parable. Then spend a little time meditating on what you have read. This doesn't mean analyzing the text, but rather simply holding it gently and ponder the words inviting the Holy Spirit to speak a word to you, which you then hold on to. Then use the word or phrase as a prayer. Ask yourself, what does this word or phrase ask of me at this time? Then lastly is simple contemplation asking the Holy Spirit to lead you driven by your prayer.



Scriptural Meditation invites you to open your imagination to being present with Christ at any time and experience of his earthly life. Find a passage from scripture, read it carefully and thoughtfully, noticing such details as - who is present, where the action is happening, what is being said, how people are reacting to Jesus. Then close your eyes and take a moment to listen to your breathing, imagine yourself in the scene you have just read. Watch, listen, and encounter Jesus. Talk to Jesus about what you need to learn.

TAKE TIME when you are in a queue, stopped at lights, sitting quietly to be aware of the prayers and worries that reside within you. Bring them to God, *let God in on your day*. Wake up in the morning and think about something you look forward to today – a cuppa with a friend, a quiet moment, a walk in the park, time with family. Always take the time to find something to look forward to each day. **MAKE TIME!**
