Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! Lord, show us your mercy and love, and grant us your salvation. Alleluia! Gospel: Matthew 24:37-44 [Stay Awake!]

Preparing to begin another year

Across the world we accept the idea of organising our lives according to a weekly, monthly and yearly calendar – twenty four hours each day, seven days each week, four weeks each month and twelve months each year: that's the accepted pattern. Our lives as Christians merge into this pattern with traditional practices such as beginning and ending each day with a time of awareness of God through the listening and speaking that we call prayer. We set aside the beginning of each week to gather together as families with our fellow Christians to listen and pray and renew our communion with God and each other and our commitment as God's agents of mercy, love and peace; and we organise our lives as believers in Jesus around a year by year recalling and reliving of the life and teaching of Jesus.

So it is that this weekend we start preparing for another year which we'll try to live in union with Jesus. We live in an "IN-BETWEEN" time: In between

- the coming of God among us in the person of Jesus; and
- the final emergence of God's Kingdom on earth, the transformation of His world and universe into what God wants it to be.

The next three and a half weeks will offer

- through passages from the Scriptures
- through our participation in end of year functions
- through exchanges of greetings and invitations
- through various usual and additional gatherings in the Cathedral
- lots of encouragement
- some warnings about distractions and obstacles in our way
- some obvious [and sometimes hidden or unrecognised] opportunities to launch us into a productive year of Christian living.

A few things jump at us out of this weekend's readings from the Scriptures:

- every day, <u>quietly like a thief who enters without our knowing</u> [because we aren't <u>awake</u>], God will be calling. In the
 midst of planning and enjoying holidays, of eating and drinking, of doing our work, paying bills, spending money, giving
 and receiving presents and greetings...God will be depending on each of us to focus on the things that really matter.
- Let's take to heart Paul's words to the first century Church community in Rome, inject light not darkness into our gatherings and to avoid the drinking orgies, the wrangling, the jealousy, the irresponsible "letting our hair down".
- Let's do our bit to hammer the swords of war into ploughshares, to generously support projects that offer food, housing, heath care, education, rather than violence and destruction that is over-running God's world.
- Let's plan our family celebrations, our neighbourhood parties, our end of work year festivities to
 - repair hurts and divisions
 - re-establish friendships
 - re-enliven connections that might have lapsed.

God is depending on us to make His/Her presence felt at the beginning and throughout 2020.
