




Easter Sunday 9 April 2023

First reading: Acts 10:34, 37-43 We have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead.
Responsorial Psalm: This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad.
Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 5:6-8 Throw away the old yeast, that you may make new dough.
Gospel Acclamation: ALLELUIA! ALLELUIA! Christ has become our sacrifice; let us feast with joy in the Lord. ALLELUIA! ALLELUIA!
Gospel: Matthew 28:1-10 He has risen from the dead and now he is going before you to Galilee.

Easter is always the same; but for me, it never gets old. It is a confronting and also comforting time. After getting to know Jesus throughout Lent, listening to accounts of His more seminal moments of ministry, Holy Week brings a new depth. We have journeyed with the man tempted in the desert, the Transfigured Lord, the traveller offering the water of life, the one who gives sight to the blind, the one who loved His friends and raised them to life, and the one proclaimed as the king, son of David. Now, passing through the paschal mystery – passion-death-resurrection – we wash up Easter Monday with nowhere to go... it seems. He has died, been buried, and risen. The story is done... and not done.

This same Lord is celebrated by each community and each person. However, it is not confined to three days (those we call '*Triduum*'); this is a mystery *every* day for *every* life.

I am writing these few sentences on Wednesday 5th April. We were invited (last Sunday) to begin a week, called 'Holy Week', to read (or listen to) the Gospel accounts of what happened to Jesus during the final days of His life among us 'in the flesh', His suffering and dying and rising from the grave to a New life.

For us this has been and is a story, first of all, about Jesus. It's movement and content are fixed in the past - two thousand years ago! It is complete and has an ending already known to us.
