ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME [Year B] Sunday 13th June, 2021

First Reading: Ezekiel 17:22-24. I have made the small tree great. **Responsorial Psalm:** Lord, it is good to give thanks to you.

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 5:6-10. Whether we are living in the body or exiled from it, we are intent on pleasing the Lord. Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! The seed is the word of God, Christ is the sower; all who come to him will live forever. Alleluia!

Gospel: Mark 4:26-34. The mustard seed, the smallest of all the seeds, grows into the biggest shrub of all.

Confirming – Affirming each other!

Every now and again we all need to re-examine ideas and practices that we have taken for granted: to "pull back the veil" a little and come to new awareness and fresh understanding.

During the past two weeks I talked with two grandmothers who were really worried about their grandchildren, neither of whom had been baptised. For both of them the baptism of newly born infants was central to opening up the gates of Heaven for them and launching them into a Christian life.

One grandmother actually confessed that she has resolved her concerns (in part) by quietly baptising her grand-daugher one morning when she was "baby-sitting". She had not yet even told the child's parents about this.

Well our discussion progressed to a lengthy discussion about the practice of Baptism through the centuries and the different understandings and practices across various Christian traditions today. We found ourselves sharing ideas about Limbo, about God's all-embracing love, about initiation into the Christian community, about the various implications and consequences of Baptism and Confirmation ... all of which are worth revisiting in more depth.

A few thoughts about Confirmation are shared in this short article – topical because there have been celebrations of Confirmation very recently in St Patrick's Cathedral and in St Thomas More's Church.

The word "Confirmation" is full of meaning, indeed a number of important meanings.

- News that something has happened often remains private, a bit like a rumour, until it is <u>confirmed</u>. The news then becomes accepted as truth, it is taken seriously, it's implications are for real, it changes the way things were.
- So the formal visit of the Bishop, the Church family's ordained leader, to <u>confirm</u> the membership of young women and men within that Church community, is meant to change things. Membership, presence within the community is affirmed, is to be taken seriously with real implications. A question and challenge for all of us is inherent in the recent Confirmation celebrations.
- As well as it being a Sacramental experience there is a broader meaning of Confirmation. All too easily we take one another for granted at our worst we "knock others", cut them down to size, put them in their place. Being part of a Christian community places on each of us a responsibility to <u>confirm</u> the value, the dignity, the God-given gifts of each other calling and enabling the inherent goodness of every creature and to <u>especially</u> rejoice and affirm the presence and action of God in and through our newly confirmed members.

I intend to send a message of encouragement and <u>confirmation</u> to our young sisters and brothers. You might consider doing this as well.
