As you can see there is a fair variety of authors and genres and themes. I like to find a book that opens my mind, and heart to something inviting and maybe a little challenging. Some also are simple murder mysteries and the like. These I call my "sorbet" books – a light book to cleanse the palate between serious ones! Some I like the authors' way of writing so like to return to their style and characters – like visiting a place you know well or putting on your favourite comfortable shoes. Some are just for fun – the Spencer Quinn books feature a dog who does the narration! But they all bring insight and joy – and the odd challenge to my year. There were a couple of other books that I couldn't finish even though I tried a couple of times to get into them – life's too short to worry about that! Like many things in life, they are let go of, and time to move onto something new.

The book I have begun 2022 with is the new book by Trent Dalton - *Love Stories*. It's a wonderful telling of people's love stories. Trent explains that he sat in various popular places around Brisbane's CBD with a sign that simply said, *'Sentimental writer collecting love stories. Do you have one to share?''* His main premise was that due to the pandemic people have become more aware of those things that are important, and remembering what we love and why, is one of those focussing points. He had no



trouble getting material. The stories will make you laugh, and cry – they will make you ponder and hope – they will bring you to a comfortable place that reminds you that everyone has a love story – what's yours?

We know our faith love story which is Christ's birth, so we can know how much God loves each one of us. So as we move into 2022 what is your love story? Have you ever told anyone? Would you – could you? At least tell God! The divine with us knows it already but wants to hear us articulate it in prayer and quiet, gentle discovery of the love that exists around us. Much like todays gospel, we are reminded that sometimes Jesus keeps the best wine to last! Drink deeply of that wine this year.
