## The Art of Being a God Parent

I believe baptism to be one of the most beautiful sacramental moments of life. Maybe not always for the child, as they are usually too young to comprehend what is happening, but for those present it can be a wonderful moment of grace. This is especially true for godparents. They have been especially asked because of the role they have played in the parent's life, and the gift they will then be to the child. So what are some of the aspects of being a Godparent? It is a gift that maybe we take all too lightly at times. During the baptismal ceremony a candle is lit for the child from the Easter candle and the priest says:

"Parents and godparents, receive the light of Christ. This light is entrusted to you to be kept burning brightly. This child of yours has been enlightened by Christ. He/she is to walk always as a child of the light. May you keep the flame of faith alive in their heart. When the Lord comes, may he/she go out to meet Him with all the saints of the heavenly kingdom."

What an awesome responsibility. So what can a godparent do to show the sincerity of the task they are undertaking? On the day, they can show a willingness to be open to whatever the day brings accepting the Spirit as it comes, be present to the moment that is, choosing to receive the grace of the sacrament, support the parents in this endeavor, and be prayerful by leaving behind any hassles of the day.

Recently I read a book about baptism and it commented on godparents taking the day seriously even when it came to choosing the present. Apart from the straightforward gifts of Bibles, medallions etc. they suggested some accompanying gifts that add to the sense of connectedness to God and all creation. Here are some of those suggestions: **Gifts of light** – A candle with the details of the baptism on it; **Gifts of water** – A small fountain gives soothing sounds for a baby or music of the sounds of the ocean; **Gifts of nature** – New life and a connection to creation can be found in flowers or by planting a tree, or bulb in the garden or giving a goldfish; **Gifts of words** – A specially written poem for the day, a baptism record book, or a book about this new life of baptism with a special message inside the cover from you; **Gifts of music** – Some modern or traditional religious music; **Gifts to hold** – Something for the crib or rocker, squeezable toys of biblical characters, giving some every anniversary builds up an atmosphere of God's presence in their room; **Gifts of memory** – photo frames to keep photos of the baptism, an album to keep cards and photos for when the child is older.

As you are aware everything seems to ebb and flow with COVID in our communities. Notwithstanding the current case/s in Brisbane we hope to be able to make some changes to the amount of people allowed in the Cathedral in the near future. If the situation of no cases in Toowoomba doesn't change then we would hope to return to full capacity seating at St Patrick's. To do this though, it requires your assistance in following certain guidelines to ensure compliance with the legislation. These changes would not come into practice until early February (all things being equal). Much like seating in a theatre, cinema or stadium we will need to have every seat numbered. You will be required to sit in the seat allocated. However to make it easier you are urged to make use of trybooking to confirm your attendance and provide your details. This will also allow you to choose you seat. So if you take note of the number on your seat, then you will be able to book that particular seat. To make the system quicker and easier to administrate we URGE you to take advantage of trybooking. Should you not have trybooked then you will be allocated a seat on arrival. As you may have noticed the system for registering at the door can be a slow process, trybooking will make it much quicker and easier. PLEASE NOTE THESE CHANGES WILL BE HAPPENING IN FEBRUARY, SO THIS IS JUST TO GIVE YOU SOME INFORMATION AND TIME TO START THINKING ABOUT WHAT IS AHEAD.
