Claverian Family

Things began in 1863 with the birth of Mary Theresa, the first child of Countess Josephine and Count Antony Ledochowski. As the little Countess grew older her exceptional talents became evident. While serving as a Lady-in-waiting at the Court to Duchess Alice of Tuscany, she wrote plays that were enacted at the principal theatres of Vienna. One could say 'she had everything at her fingertips'. **Chosen by God** to later found an extremely important and unique ministry in the Church, the

talented Mary Theresa was also a very faith-filled person. At the age of sixteen she was heard to say: "I too want to do something great for God". Being open to the voice of God she listened carefully for his plans and directions.

What did she hear? The sufferings of Africans, particularly of African women caught up in the slave trade of that time.

What did she do? She left the court and her literary career, rented a room and slowly but surely organised her unique mission of 'charitable service on behalf of the missionary activity of the Church'; of being an authentic link between Missionaries and the Home Front. It is a great grace to be chosen by God as Missionaries, but once in foreign lands they need another grace: that of receiving assistance in their ministry.

Here we are today, implementing that charism, that role, given to us through our Foundress Blessed Mary Theresa; using, in as far as we can, modern means to accomplish fruitful results for the glory of God; by the free gift of ourselves through living the Vows of Consecrated Religious Life, aiding thousands of souls to find their way into God's Kingdom.

What does our apostolate mean to Missionaries? I could give many examples from my six years of service at the General House in Rome as coordinator of our universal mission apostolate, but I will give just one which sums up the beautiful plan and delightful providence of God. When Bishops and Missionaries, both religious and lay, visit Rome most of them call on us; showing gratitude and seeking assistance. One day four Bishops from Nigeria came together, setting out plans for e.g. a needed project for funding, for Vestments, Chalices, Mass Kits.... During their visit I noticed one was rather silent. Sometime later he wrote: "Thank you for the great boost you gave to our evangelising activity. It was as if you had been waiting from all eternity for us to be there at that moment to give us what we needed."

What was he trying to tell us? He had seen the Providence of God in our listening ears and providing hands. Then he went on his way praising God... Missionaries need a little help and a few words of encouragement.

How can we be God's listening ears and providing hands? Only through you, and others 'with open hearts ready to give'. You, our co-missionaries could spend your time and savings in other ways, but because of your loving concern you are with us. We treasure your cooperation, your goodness. Pray for us as we do for you, to continue to be God's ears and hands for the poor.

Finally, a suggestion: Please take a copy of our mission *Echo* with you after Mass today and spread its news on behalf of missionaries, gain new subscribers. There is no fixed subscription rate, just a donation according to possibilities.
