Synod of Bishops in Rome 2021

Last weekend the Synod of Bishops was formally opened with an inclusive Mass with Pope Francis in St. Peter's Basilica followed by a time of reflection and direction for the Synod. The Synod is being called to look at "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission." This Synod will convene for 2 years with a final document produced for Pope Francis in October 2023. There will be many different levels of consultation throughout the world. The process is a little reminiscent of our own Plenary Council Process.

We begin with the question "How does the "journeying together," which takes place today on different levels (from the local level to the universal one), allow the Church to proclaim the Gospel in accordance with the mission entrusted to Her; and what steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow as a synodal Church?

What does a Synodal Church look like, you may ask? In some ways it is referring to the ways of governance within the church. A synodal church is one that listens to everyone's views/ideas/reflections/conversations/visions and allows the Spirit to help discern movement into the future. In real terms it attempts to address the, perhaps ignored desire of Vatican II – PARTICIPATION. A truly synodal church moves away from hierarchal approach and attempt to combat clericalism.

In his homily at the opening Mass, Pope Francis spoke of the need in this process towards a truly synodal understanding to contain the following. We need to -

ENCOUNTER: In the Gospels, we often see Jesus on a journey, open to encounter with those He meets along the way, present to them, and concerned about their questions. Like Jesus, we too are called to become experts in the art of encounter. This involves an openness to God, taking time for prayer and adoration, and listening to what the Holy Spirit tells us. It also requires openness to others, as well as courage and a willingness to allow ourselves to be challenged by the presence and the stories of others.

LISTEN: True encounters only come through listening to others, noting Jesus listens not just with the ears, but with the heart. When we follow Jesus in listening with the heart people feel they are being heard, not judged, they feel free to recount their experiences and their spiritual journey. We need to ask ourselves are we good at listening if we allow others to express themselves? Let us not soundproof our hearts; let us not remain barricaded in our certainties. DISCERN: Encounter and listening are not ends in themselves, but must lead to discernment. Whenever we enter into dialogue we allow ourselves to be challenged, to advance on the journey. As with the rich man, Jesus helps us to discern – to look within, and to discover what God reveals to us, to discern in the light what our hearts truly treasure. The synod journey is a spiritual discernment that takes place in adoration , in prayer and in dialogue with the Word of God. For more regarding the Synod https://www.synod.va/en.html
