26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

1 October 2023

First reading: Ezekial 18:25-28 The sinner who decides to turn against sinfulness deserves to live. **Responsorial Psalm:** Remember your mercies, O Lord.

Second Reading: Philippians 2:1-11 In your mimd you must be the same as Christ Jesus. **Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia alleluia!** My sheep listen to my voice, says the Lord; I know them, and they follow me. **Alleluia!**

Gospel: Matthew 21:28-32 He went out moved by regret. The tax collectors and prostitutes will precede you into the kingdom of God.

Sometimes life can seem like this cartoon – more complicated than simple! The scribes and Pharisees who were listening recognise todays story as understanding family relationships. The first son, the rude rebel, declares that he would not go and work. In doing this in a society that holds fast to saving face, the son by refusing, wounds his father's dignity and the family's reputation. In contrast the second son immediately honours his father even using the word, "Sir" and shows great respect. Yet then comes the twist in the tale, the one who rebels goes and works in the field, and the one who superficially shows honour does not. So the underlying message shows how important it is for us to exercise orthopraxis, which the Scribes and the Pharisees fail to do. In others words, doing what we say. To understand the message of Christ and to follow.

If we were to recontextualise this for our twentieth century world it would be the same message but there are deeper questions to ask ourselves. It involves knowing ourselves so well that our actions follow our words correctly. This takes time, prayer and inner reflection.



"OK, one more time: Go home and log on to our website from your computer, create an account and purchase your ticket with your credit or debit card, download the ticket to a smartphone, then come back at the allocated time... Just what part of 'easier and more convenient' don't you get?"

When we think about it, this has been a common theme throughout these last couple of weeks. Jesus spoke of the need to forgive and repair our relationships with our brother (and sister) and with our communities when we have wronged them, or been wronged by them. To do this well and with lasting effect we need to spend time journeying with our pain and hurt and choose to make a change to bring peace to ourselves and those around us. Then last week we had the grumblings of workers because the employer (God) wants to be generous. The greatest enemy of knowing ourselves well is when we compare ourselves to others because when we waste time comparing we lose sight of how God has been generous to us personally. Opportunities for a fuller life have been lost because we don't know our inner spirit well enough.

Today's gospel opens to us the possibility that we know ourselves so well inwardly that our words and actions will flow without hesitation. Life is never as clear cut as that though, is it? We all experience life differently at different ages and stages as we grow in age, wisdom and spirit. The irony of the satirical cartoon above assumes everyone is at the same stage of life when changes occur – young, Tech savvy, and able. Yet as I said to someone last week maybe it's time you "acted your age." I didn't in any way mean this in a negative or nasty way but believe it or not in a positive and life giving way. When we take the time to love ourselves and reflect on the depth of God's generosity than we can see that God is active and alive in our present moment. If we spend too much time grumbling about how we can't do what we used to do or such like, we lose the opportunity in front of us to see God at work. "Acting our age" is about being in the present, not lamenting the past, but remembering it with joy, and it's not about worrying about the future, it's about experiencing the joy filled generosity of the present.

Let this gospel seep into your life. If you know yourself well enough and respond accordingly and say YES to God's loving presence in your life, than you will know how to live for today. God's promise of being in the Kingdom can become true for you this day.
