G'day all,

My name is Nathan. I am the fourth child of Paul and Fiona; born and bred in Toowoomba surrounded by siblings. Fr Gonzo was a wonderful pastor and supervisor for that time. I am grateful for this time and the many graces that I encountered in the communities. This led me back to the Seminary for my final year of formation there, leading into the ordination last weekend.

I would like to take this opportunity to formally thank the parish for accommodating the diaconate celebrations last week. I am very grateful for the welcome that I have received so far, and look forward to getting to know many of you as I immerse myself in the life of this parish community.

It is time to set the theology books aside for a time (or, at least, lower their intensity). I enjoy music (listening and playing), literature, history, riding, and martial arts. Hopefully these might offer opportunities and avenues to engage with the real lives of people back here in Toowoomba.

My thanks goes out to Bishop Robert for ordaining me. Also, thanks to Fr Michael who, with the parish team here, will be guiding my ongoing formation as a Deacon. I have been a Christian for as long as I can remember, but I am as yet a novice deacon. So, I ask for your prayers and support as I enter this ministry of service.

St Patrick's Cathedral Financial Report (2020 – 2021)

For all of us, to say this has been another challenging year is a bit of an understatement! As a community we have tried to maintain a sense of connection and support, while sharing the desire to be aware of the common good.

Whilst 2021 has continued to be a difficult year, for everyone, in regards to finances, we are more than ever grateful to all those who have been able to contribute to the continuing life of the Cathedral through donations of any kind. This year we were significantly helped by the Government's JobKeeper assistance scheme which contributed \$123,060 to our surplus. Due to your continued generosity in previous years to giving, we still have a strong and stable reserve to draw on. This year thankfully we were again able to replenish some of the reserves used last financial year. However as you would be aware the more we draw on that reserve, the more precarious that safeguard becomes. Thanks again to your generosity last financial year, supporting the return of Bingo, and with Government assistance we were able to post a surplus of \$165,180 for all areas. In general terms, as we look at each component of St Patrick's operational areas, we can see the difference in income. *Previous year's amounts will be shown in brackets*.

Starting with the **Cathedral** income we can see the giving was \$184,476 (2020/2021 - \$199,752 and 2019/2020 - \$250,233) and after Cathedral expenses a surplus of \$21,950 was recorded.

In the area of the **Parish Office and Parish House**, there is a deficit of \$195,222 (2020/2021 - \$207,017.44 and 2019/2020 - \$195,930). This deficit includes a significant amount of the JobKeeper allowance. The income areas of these two places is very limited, so a deficit is a yearly expectation.

The two sets of **Units** – Hill Street and Ave Maria in Ruthven Street continue to provide a good yearly income for the parish. The surplus for this financial year was \$48,017. (2020/2021 - \$52,348.95 and 2019/2020 - \$64,216.27) again including JobKeeper. The difference this year is due to the much needed complete refurbishment of a number of units as they become vacant and the lengthier vacancy time of a unit. Last financial year \$32,663 was spent refurbishing two units.


Bingo continues to be the main source of income to the Parish and under Anthony King's careful management has again provided a much needed surplus to cover the above mentioned parish deficits. We thank Anthony King and his team of volunteers for all their hard work in making sure this occurs each year for the parish. This year's surplus was of \$268,704, which includes a JobKeeper component of \$40,681. (2020/2021 - \$104,385.73 and 2019/2020 - \$137,597.86). Connected to the Cathedral Centre is the **hiring** of the venue, which again is lower this financial year than in previous years, the surplus is \$21,730. (2020/2021 - \$25,261.19 and 2019/2020 - \$34,690.76).

Thankfully with all this taken into account we were able to secure a profit for the year. Thank you to the wonderful team on the Finance Committee – Celia Waters, Robert Wiemers, Kerry Shine, Shane Kennett, Basil Dass and Jim Whitney. We also acknowledge the contribution of Robert Wiemers who will be moving from Toowoomba at the end of this year – thank you Bob for your wisdom and skills.

Thank you once again for your thoughtfulness toward the continued stability of our parish.

On the previous page there are some suggestions for ways to give, should you wish to consider an alternative system. Thank you to all the staff, especially the office staff, and volunteers at St. Patrick's for their wonderful sense of teamwork, especially during these trying times.
