## THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME [Year B] Sunday 24<sup>TH</sup> January, 2021

**First Reading:** Jonah 3:1-5,10 – The Ninevites renounced their evil ways.

**Responsorial Psalm:** Teach me your ways, O Lord.

**Second Reading:** 1 Corinthians 7:29-31 – The world as we know it is passing away.

Gospel Acclamation: ALLELUIA! ALLELUIA! The kingdom of God is near: believe the Good News. ALLELUIA!

Gospel: Mark 1:14-20 - Repent and believe the Good News.

## ...And Immediately They Followed Him....

In Marks Gospel (1:14-20) Jesus begins his public ministry by proclaiming the Good News of God. The Good news comes from God and God Himself is the content. He calls four (Simon Peter, Andrew, James and John) fishermen at the sea of Galilee. Jesus sees something in them, not necessarily what they are, but what they could be. And they see something in Jesus that causes them to leave what they value and follow Him, in response to His call. In other words, God does not choose the equipped, He equips the chosen.

The word "vocation" comes from the Latin "vocare", meaning "to call". It is clear that these men did not seek to become disciples of Jesus but it was Jesus who called them, thus by their generous response becoming followers.

I grew up in a Muslim country residing in Dubai since the time of my infancy. I received my calling right after my university graduation in International Tourism and Marketing. It was a clear voice that spoke to my heart which said "leave everything, and follow me".

This was when I had decided to sell all my possessions, leave my home, family and travel into the unknown, to follow Jesus in pursuit of my vocation in a country where it is possible. This Gospel passage to this day resonates and fills my heart with joy as I continue to persevere for the priesthood in my third year at Holy Spirit Seminary in Banyo. Looking back, I have no regrets, and a sense of fulfilment in my journey is an assurance I'm living the life I was born to live.

When we read this passage, we find that the disciples were chosen and called personally by Jesus. However, His calling is not

limited to clergy but to every single one of us. As baptised Christians, we are called to build up the Kingdom of God in different fields and careers in our lives by spreading and living the Gospel.

To pursue our vocations in life it takes grace and courage as we respond willingly. We will find that God's call is always into an uncertain future. Even though we may not know where we are going, we can be sure that He is guiding us in accordance with His will, as we find meaning and purpose in our vocation.

I like to reflect on Mary the Mother of God as a model for bringing God's will to our lives. Her *fiat* (let it be done) or "yes" to God speaks eloquently to us.

When we respond to His will, we allow Him to work within us and allow Mary to work with Him in us to build up the Kingdom of Heaven here on earth.
