FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER [Year B] Sunday 25TH April, 2021

First Reading: Acts 4:8-12. This is the only name by which we can be saved. **Responsorial Psalm:** The stone rejected by the builders has become the cornerstone.

Second Reading: 1 John 3:1-2. We shall see God as he is.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia! I am the good shepherd, says the Lord; I know my sheep, and mine know me. Alleluia!

Gospel: John 10:11-18. The good shepherd lays down his life for his sheep.

Year of St Joseph (December 8th 2020 to December 8th 2021). [Part one]

As you may be aware Pope Francis proclaimed that we commemorate St Joseph this year. It is an opportunity for us to consider this mostly hidden figure of the New Testament. The Apostolic Letter from Pope Francis is titled, "Patris Corde" – "With a Father's Heart: that is how Joseph loved Jesus, whom all four gospels refer to as "the son of Joseph".

Pope Francis speaks of his own desire to share his personal reflections on this extraordinary figure who was so close to our human experience. Through this time of pandemic, Pope Francis believes it is even more heightened. So like St Joseph, "amid the crisis our lives are woven together and sustained by ordinary people, people often overlooked. People who do not appear in newspaper and magazine headlines, or on the latest television shows, yet in these very days are surely shaping the decisive events of our history. Doctors, nurses, storekeepers and supermarket workers, cleaning personnel, caregivers, transport workers, men and women working to provide essential services and public safety, volunteers, priests, men and women religious, and so very many others. They understand no one is saved alone....How many fathers, mothers, grandparents, and teachers are showing children, in small everyday ways, how to accept and deal with a crisis by adjusting their routines, looking ahead and encouraging the practice of prayer. Each of us can discover in Joseph – the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet hidden presence – an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble. St Joseph reminds us that those who appear hidden or in the shadows can play an incomparable role in the history of salvation. A word of recognition and gratitude to them all."

From this introduction Pope Francis explores some of the aspects of St Joseph that are close to his heart. He begins with St Joseph as "a beloved father". "The greatness of St Joseph is that he was the spouse of Mary and father of Jesus. In this way, he placed himself, in the words of St. John Chrysostom, "at the service of the entire plan of salvation." Then St Joseph as "a tender and loving father" "As the Lord had done for Israel, so Joseph did with Jesus; he taught him to walk, taking him by the hand; he was for him like a father who raises an infant to his cheeks, bending down to him and feeding him. In Joseph, Jesus saw the tender love of God. Joseph, then, teaches us that faith in God includes believing that God can work even through our fears, our frailities and our weaknesses. Also Joseph is "an obedient father". Through the difficult decisions Joseph had to make he realised that "obedience made it possible for him to surmount his difficulties and spare Mary" any shame. "In his role as head of the family, Joseph taught Jesus to be obedient to his parents, in accordance with God's command."

"An accepting father" means "Joseph accepted Mary unconditionally. He trusted the angel's words. Often in life, things happen whose meaning we do not understand. Our first reaction is frequently one of disappointment or rebellion....only as a result of acceptance, this reconciliation, can we begin to glimpse a broader history and a deeper meaning."
